Nov. 30--Dead fish continued to wash ashore in Cocoa Beach on Thursday, likely the latest effect from a bloom of **red tide** that has haunted the state's east coast for two months.

Hundreds of mullet were cleared off the beach, but more continued to appear, Cocoa Beach Public Information Officer Jerry Stansfield said. The state Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has closed several shellfish-harvesting areas in Volusia and Brevard counties because clams and oysters eat **red-tide** algae and store the toxins in their bodies. Those toxins, often pushed into the air by crashing waves, can **cause** respiratory irritation when people breathe them in and gastrointestinal distress and dizziness when people eat shellfish that have ingested it. They can also kill fish.

Red tide

ecological phenomenon, also known as harmful algal bloom, or HAB. Red tides occur when coastal waters become overpopulated with certain types of algae and **phytoplankton**, including dinoflagellates, a type of single-celled algae. Many of the plankton species associated with red tides produce potent toxins that pose a serious threat to fisheries, marine ecosystems, wildlife, and human health. Once found primarily in the coastal waters of the United States and Europe, red tides have become a global problem.

Dinoflagellates are members of the phylum Pyrrophyta, which is part of the kingdom Protista. Dinoflagellates are single-celled organisms that contain chlorophyll and can photosynthesize food; they usually have two flagella, which are tail-like structures that help to propel the organism through the water. The dominant mode of reproduction is asexual; that is, the cells divide repeatedly, which can result in a rapidly increasing population under certain circumstances. Some species of dinoflagellate remain dormant for years, buried in sediment until favorable ecological conditions provoke the onset of germination. Many dinoflagellates undergo numerous life stages during their development; *Pfiesteria piscida*, for example, has 24 known life stages.

The term red tide originated because some dinoflagellates contain reddish pigments. When these species reach high



You can retrieve results from a variety of media sources with our search functionality. Simply type in a word or phrase in the search box, then click SEARCH to begin.

Source Types:

You can narrow your search by selecting source types with a simple on and off toggle feature. A check mark in the source type box will search the corresponding media or publication type. If the source type is not checked, it will not be searched. The Select All option allows you to search through all the source types, while Clear All will allow you to clear all the options and select the specific media or publication source you need. For example, if you want a picture of a polar bear, turn off all source types except Pictures before you start the search.

Different Search Methods:

Natural Language Search — With the Natural Language Search option you can enter a full sentence or phrase to receive relevance-ranked results. Both "distance of the earth from the sun" or a question: "What is the distance of the earth from the Sun?" will work. Place your search terms in context instead of using a single word for the best results.

Boolean Search — The Boolean Search option allows you to enter multiple key words, or combine words and phrases to precisely target your search. The Boolean operators, AND, OR, and AND NOT are the tools that give you such precise control.

Advanced Search:

By using the Advanced Search features, you can narrow any search by publication date, article title, publisher, author or reading level, with or without entering search text. Note that searching with too little detail can flood you with results that you don't need. On the other hand, a search that's too specific may cut out information you do need.
