

# **Eligibility**

- Persons who are totally or legally blind.
- Persons with visual disabilities who are unable to read standard print clearly and comfortably for a reasonable length of time.
- Persons with physical disabilities who cannot hold a book, turn pages, or focus on printed material due to muscle or nerve deterioration, paralysis, or some other disabling condition.
- Eligibility must be certified by one
  of the following: doctor of
  medicine, doctor of osteopathy,
  ophthalmologist, optometrist,
  psychologist, registered nurse,
  therapist, and professional staff of
  hospitals, institutions, and public
  or welfare agencies (such as an
  educator, a social worker, case
  worker, counselor, rehabilitation
  teacher, certified reading
  specialist, school psychologist,
  superintendent, or librarian).
- Persons unable to read due to a temporary visual/physical disability (such as recuperation from surgery) for the duration of the disabling condition.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### Is there a charge?

These services are provided at no charge by the North Dakota State Library and the National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled.

#### Will I have to pay for postage?

All materials, including players, talking books, and accessories are mailed to you at no charge. You may also return all materials at no charge via the United States Postal Service "Free Matter for the Blind and Physically Handicapped" privilege.

#### Are downloadable books available?

Yes. ND Talking Books and the National Library Service offer a service that allows patrons to download books to a computer, where they may be transferred to a cartridge or USB media and played on digital talking book players. Digital books or audio books are also available through the BARD Mobile App, which can be found in your device's app store.
