## Changes to the Online Catalog

Starting December 11, the North Dakota State Library will have a brand new online catalog available for patrons to use.

## What this means for you:

You will still be able to search for items like you normally would, but the interface will look a little different and will have new features, like an ever-changing new book display.

Since there will be multiple libraries around the state on the same catalog, when you conduct a search, you will see the availability of the item at each library. This will make requesting items a lot simpler and more user-friendly.

While we migrate to the new catalog, the old one will not be available. This means we will be unable to fulfill hold requests, return items, or renew items between December 5 and 10. If you need an item during this time, please contact us. If it is available in the State Library's collection, we will be able to check it out for you.

Some of these new changes may be challenging, and there are always bugs to work out when a library migration happens, but, overall, we feel you will be happy with the new catalog.

## Blood Ties By Quincy J. Allen

Blood Ties by Quincy J. Allen is the first novel in the Blood War Chronicles, and let me tell you, it isn't my usual cup of tea, but I loved it! It started out slow with backstory, but when it picked up, it really picked up! The author describes the book as an Epic Western Steampunk Fantasy. And that description couldn't be more accurate. The steampunk world is fascinating, and incorporating it into a novel is something that I haven't seen much of before.

This novel follows Jake Lasater and his crew. He is a gunslinger that lives in Colorado after losing his legs and an arm in the Civil War. However, he was fitted up with state of the art mechanical limbs with a bit of magic thrown into them to make him better than he was before. Jake is approached for a job in San Francisco and though he isn't keen to return there, he doesn't say "no." That's when the real excitement starts. The story really starts to pick up when he and his
 crew are on their way to the City by the Bay. Soon, the gunslinger is embroiled in a fight with foreign assassins, the Chinese mafia, and the woman he was hired by.
