Major Pettigrew's Last Stand by Helen Simonson

Major Pettigrew's Last Stand is a delightful book I'd compare to A Man Called Ove by Backman. This is Helen Simonson's first novel, which is set in the English countryside. The Major is drawn to Mrs. Ali, an immigrant from Pakistan who runs the local shop. They share a love of reading and are in similar circumstances since both of their spouses have passed away. Roger, the Major's son, disapproves of their blossoming relationship. The Major disapproves of many of Roger's actions too (which brings to mind the character Maggie Smith played in Downton Abbey). There's much more to the plot that I'll let you discover, but let me share some of Simonson's lovely sentences with you. Here's one: "He opened his mouth to say that she looked extremely beautiful and deserved



armfuls of roses, but the words were lost in committee somewhere, shuffled aside by the parts of his head that worked full-time on avoiding ridicule." And this is a gem too: "You are not the first man to miss a woman's more subtle communication," said the Major. "They think they are waving when we see only the calm sea, and pretty soon everybody drowns."
