

One of the most popular Universal Class courses is Norse Mythology 101.

Thor, Odin, and Valhalla are names you've probably heard of before, but did you know that they represent one of the most unique religions ever conceived?

The Norse/Vikings/Scandinavians were part of one of the most dominant and different civilizations to ever grace the Earth, and the combination of their civilization and belief systems has puzzled outsiders for ages. Dive into the Norse world and learn about the roots of their beliefs, dangerous sea explorations, human sacrifice, the holy city of Uppsala, and Valhalla.

This course includes eight lessons, 17 exams and assignments, and takes about four hours to complete. If you don't want the continuing education credit, this course is available as a video audit.

Book Review "Ready to Fly: How Sylvia Townsend Became the Bookmobile Ballerina" by Lea Lyon and A. LaFaye Reviewed by Abby Ebach

"Ready to Fly" includes a little bit of everything I love about nonfiction children's books—beautiful artwork, a simple story that flows, and, in the end, historical context and further reading recommendations.

Sylvia Townsend grew up in 1950s segregated America, but she doesn't let that stop her from becoming like the ballerinas she sees on stage. Using her local bookmobile, she checks out books to teach herself to become a ballerina, complete with a tutu made out of scarves and a barre made out of old chairs and a broom. Soon, Sylvia is teaching ballet classes to the other children in the neighborhood as well.





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
