Book Review

"Leave Only Footprints: My Acadia-to-Zion Journey Through Every National Park" by Conor Knighton Reviewed by Shari Mosser

I started watching Conor Knighton when he helped launch Current TV and was the host of infoMania, a weekly round-up of news, pop culture, and politics. The network folded, and he moved around to different jobs. But then he sort of fell off the map. Turns out he was following a much different map of his own.

In 2015, Conor was dumped by his fiancée. Looking at the changes in his life, he pitched an idea to CBS Sunday Morning where he would visit all 59 "official" National Parks during the 100th anniversary of the National Park Service. CBS bought the idea of a few stories, but that allowed Conor to visit the rest of the parks on his own. So began his year of living on the road and experiencing the beauty of the National Park system.



This book is a touching, funny tour of the weird and wonderful in the American wild. Whether he's waking up early for a naked scrub in a historic bathhouse in Arkansas or staying up late to stargaze along our loneliest highways in Nevada, Conor shares an informative and entertaining dispatch from what can be considered the road trip of a lifetime. These are the stories you are not likely to find in any guidebook.

Filled with fascinating tidbits about our parks' past and reflections on their fragile future, this book is both a celebration of and a passionate case for the natural wonders that all Americans share.
