#### FEE CHANGE

The Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic program in Princeton New Jersey has adopted a new fee schedule for their patrons. The old fee was \$50 for a lifetime membership. This has now been changed to a one time \$50 start-up fee plus \$25 the first year and \$25 per year thereafter. They have the largest audio collection of educational material in the world, including textbooks, fiction, drama, and poetry in many languages.
