

Evaluation Visit

Steve Prine, Head of Network Services Section for the National Library Services (NLS), visited the North Dakota State Library in September. The purpose of the visit was to evaluate services and resources of the ND State Library's Services for the Disabled according to national guidelines.

Prine was pleased with the progress the library has made during the past year. In his report Prine said, "the regional library has made tremendous progress in it's first year." Many of the recommendations for improvements are already in progress or in the planning stages. Prine said he and the entire staff at NLS have been impressed with the level of support the library has received from patrons and with the level of service the library has maintained throughout the last year.

New Service

The ND School for the Blind is offering a new program for individuals who are print impaired. It's called ND News Voice and will provide subscribers access to statewide newspapers with the use of a touch-tone telephone. The Grand Forks Herald will be the first paper to go on the system, and should be available by mid-January. The system offers subscribers a chance to browse through the newspaper 24 hours a day.

There will be a \$10 per month subscription fee which will include access to a toll-free number. Subscribers will be able to try the service for two weeks free of charge. ND News Voice is made available through grants from the Otto Bremer Foundation, ND Department of Human Services Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Older Blind Program, and the ND State Council on Developmental Disabilities.

Circulation

We thought you may be interested to know that over the past year, patrons of the ND Talking Books Service have been sent over 57,000 talking books. We presently have 2,260 active patrons using the service and that number is growing all the time!

Christmas Program

You may have heard some new voices on Dakota Radio over the past holiday season. A number of Christmas stories were aired each Wednesday in December to celebrate Christmas. North Dakota's first lady, Nancy Schafer, read *The Mysterious Star* by Joanne Marxhausen.
