A volunteer recognition ceremony was held at the Kelly Inn in Bismarck on May 29. Over 40 volunteers for the State Library were acknowledged and thanked for their hours of service to the State Library, especially in serving the needs of the disabled through Dakota Radio Information Service (DRIS) and the Talking Books Program. They received certificates and a gift in recognition of their volunteer hours.

The keynote speaker was Mike Goehring, Director Great Plains Assistance Dogs Foundation, Jud, ND. Goehring brought a German Shepard pup named Mac to demonstrate how dogs are used to assist people with physical disabilities, including paralysis and seizures. Refreshments were served and entertainment was provided by the Bismarck singing group Surrogate Sisters.

David Lee received the 1997 Special Volunteer Award for outstanding service to the agency. A special plaque was unveiled with the names of volunteers who have given 300 or more hours of service to the State Library.



Author published

North Dakota author Richard Moquist has published his second novel and it is due out in July. Moquist decided to try a hand at writing ten years ago after he was diagnosed with macular degeneration. He says he took a writing class at Moorhead State University and it was there he was urged to take his writing more seriously. He also had a short story published in 1991 in a monthly detective magazine and his first book was published over three years ago by a small publisher.

The publisher of his new book is hopeful that his current mystery, titled *Eye of the Agency*, could be a top seller this summer. He is already working on another mystery set in his hometown of South Minnesota. Moquist has been a patron of the North Dakota talking book with a since 1989.
