The winners will be determined by the number of book reports you send to us at the State Library. Last year's winners were awarded tee-shirts, book bags and some even received gift certificates to Space Aliens in Bismarck for their efforts.



Old Time Radio Shows

Every 3rd and 4th Thursday of each month listeners of Dakota Radio Information Service can tune in at 10 a.m. for some old time radio shows. The special programming started in January and will continue until we have run each of 269 different shows.

The shows that will be aired include Bob Hope, Charlie McCarthy, The Green Hornet, Baby Snooks and Amos-n-Andy. Many of our patrons have called in the past to ask about old time radio shows and whether they were available through the talking books program.

Since the shows are not part of the National Library Service program, we cannot send them out as free matter to our patrons. To hear these shows you can tune into Dakota Radio Information Service and hear two half-hour shows the 3rd and 4th Thursdays of the month.

These tapes are also available for check-out through the State Library. Remember, you will be responsible for return postage to the library since they are not part of the National Library Services for the Blind and Physically Handicapped.
