Headphone Shortage

The Machine Lending Agency at the North Dakota School for the Blind is experiencing a shortage of headphones. The headphones are provided to our patrons to use in conjunction with the talking book machine. Unfortunately with an increase in our patron database, we must ask any new patrons to purchase their own headphones.

If you were issued a pair by the School for the Blind and are not using them, we would appreciate it if you would return them to the ND School for the Blind at 500 Stanford Road, Suite A, Grand Forks ND 58203.

Any headphones will work with the cassette player, but you may have to buy a small adapter plug to make it fit properly. These can be purchased at many local discount stores such as Wal-Mart. Target, or Radio Shack.

Defective Tapes



If you encounter a problem with one of your talking book tapes, make sure you mark the defective tape with a string or rubber band before you send it back. This is a big help to us, because then we can fix or replace the defective tape before it goes out to the next patron.

If you would like another copy of this particular book, you need to call us or write us with the cassette number or title so we can send it out to you again. We do not automatically send tapes back that have been returned as damaged.

Tutorial for Windows

Large Print

The North Dakota State Library has an extensive collection of large print books. These titles can be sent out free-matter to patrons of the ND State Library Talking Book Program. All you need to do is sign up for a state library card and contact us with your requests.

Your selections will be mailed directly to your home and you will be able to mail them back to the library at no cost.

If you order large print books, we will not be able to track the titles you read as we do with our collection of talking books. You will be responsible for calling in your requests when you are in need of books, and you must keep track of the titles you have read.

All North Dakota citizens have access to the library's book collection by applying for a state library card. There is no charge to get a card and books can be checked out by visiting the library or by calling in an order and having them sent by mail. Books checked out to patrons who live in Bismarck or Mandan cannot be mailed, they must be picked up at the library

If you are not a patron of the ND talking books library you will be responsible for the return postage on any books that are mailed to you.
