Walk-in Service

Walk-in service is available to all patrons of the North Dakota State Library. This includes patrons of the talking book program. You are welcome to stop by and pick up your book orders, or get one-on-one assistance in choosing your reading material. It is a good idea to call and talk with a reader advisor about your order before stopping by the library. This gives us an opportunity to search for your requested material and have it ready for you when you arrive.

For the Best Service

The library receives a large number of phone calls from talking book patrons every day. When you call and are unable to reach a reader advisor, they may be on the phone or with another patron and unable to take your call at this time. If this happens, please leave a message with your name and phone number and one of our staff will get back to you as soon as possible.

We would also like to remind you to call at least one day in advance with your book orders, so we can process your requests in a timely manner. It is not always possible to get your talking books out the same day you call. Please remember that when you order a specific title, it does not mean it will automatically be sent to you right away. Sometimes the books you order are not available, because they are checked out to other patrons. When this happens, the request is added to your file and sent to you when a copy becomes available. One thing you can do to prevent running out of books is to order plenty of titles so we have a larger selection from which to choose.

Problem Tapes

If you experience problems with any of your tapes, please mark the defective tape with a string or rubber band and then call the library to inform us of the problem. Please provide us with the tape number and the side with which you are having problems. If you wish to receive another copy of the tape you must let us know because we do not automatically send another copy without a request from you. Due to postal regulations please do not send notes to us in the green tape containers. Hand written notes are not acceptable as free matter and must include postage.

Textbooks

If you are in need of textbooks on tape for the classroom, you must order these directly from Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic in Princeton New Jersey. This program does require a fee of \$75.00 the first year and then \$25.00 per year after that to use the service. If you would like an application you may contact the State Library and we will be happy to provide you with the information you need.
