Correction Statement on Ancestry Database

A prior email to SCHLIBTALK listed Ancestry as one of the five databases that are accessible only with a public or state library card. After reviewing our contract, we are happy to say that Ancestry allows on-site access in ALL North Dakota libraries.

Due to COVID, Ancestry has offered access to in-home use. They continue to extend these permissions as the Pandemic lingers. Access is now through March 31st. We will update you if a new extension is released.

To access Ancestry at home, patrons can use a public or state library card or use their institution's remote access code and password. Remember, barcodes and access numbers should never be listed on websites, nor should they be shared with people who are not patrons of your library. 

New Book Club Kit: *Tribe: On Homecoming and Belonging* by Sebastian Junger

This month, we are highlighting one of the State Library's newest book club kits: *Tribe: On Homecoming and Belonging* by Sebastian Junger.

Sebastian Junger is known for writing compelling nonfiction that highlights the true nature of its topics, whether that be war or natural disasters. In *Tribe: On Homecoming and Belonging*, he takes it a step further to look at veterans' lives when they return home. Using history, psychology, and anthropology, Junger digs into the individualist societies we have created and how they are at odds with what makes a soldier successful in combat and ancient human behaviors. Drawing upon a study that shows a large



percentage of military suicides being from veterans, Junger asks what the government and society can do to help veterans overcome not only the traumas of their enlistment but the trauma of coming home and reintegrating into their communities.

"Humans don't mind hardship, in fact they thrive on it; what they mind is not feeling necessary. Modern society has perfected the art of making people not feel necessary. It's time for that to end." — Sebastian Junger

This kit comes with ten books, one discussion guide, and one sign-in sheet.

Kits can be checked out for eight weeks and reserved up to one year in advance. Book club kits can check out to libraries or individual patrons; no more than three kits can be checked out at one time. Kits for schools or classroom use need to be checked out by the Library Media Specialist. To see when this book club is next available, check out <u>KitKeeper</u>.
