Britannica Public Library delivers two sites in one, with separate home pages and resources for adults and children that allow libraries to tailor the site to patrons' needs. This database includes thousands of magazine and journal articles, more than 24,000 primary sources, and 90,000 images, videos, and audio clips.



Britannica School gives teachers and students instant access to four complete encyclopedias that ensure consistency with classroom topics and age-appropriate language. This unique database also offers high-quality online learning materials that are developed by teachers and curriculum experts.

Connect With Your Community

The **<u>Rural Libraries and Social Wellbeing Toolkit</u>** is a wonderful resource the compiles 3 years of research in rural communities of less than 2,500 people. Through their research, the team interviewed librarians and community members with the goal of creating guides to help communities embrace their libraries as a cooperative resource. They believe that the library is a pathway to social connection and assists in the overall wellbeing of the community members. The entire project consists of full interviews, statistical data, conceptual deep dives into 8 case-study libraries, and the newly available toolkits.

The toolkits developed are short, simple walkthroughs to guide the library through the process of turning information and data into action and identifying areas to focus on in the future. "Rural libraries are doing incredible work, turning social connection into belonging, mutual support, and social wellbeing improvements."

The toolkits focus on belonging, capacity, discovery, self-determination, and wellness.
