LSTA Task Force

The State Library invites members of the North Dakota Library Community to volunteer to serve on our newly formed LSTA task force. We would like broad representation from all library types, as well as different sized libraries; frontline staff are encouraged to consider volunteering. The North Dakota Library Coordinating Council, the NDLA Executive Board, and ODIN will be represented on the task force, and we hope to have representatives from academic, public, school, special, and tribal libraries.

The purpose of the task force is two-fold; the first purpose is to help us develop a plan to spend our American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) monies, and the second purpose is to provide feedback on our LSTA Five-year Evaluation and Plan. The evaluation will be completed this fall, and the plan will be developed in the spring.

The LSTA Plan is the guidelines for how we spend our federal monies, and we would value having input from the library community as we develop those guidelines for the next five years. You can see our current <u>plan</u> and the last <u>evaluation</u> on the State Library's website. We anticipate the task force meeting twice a month through June of 2021 and then once a month through the spring of 2022.
