Emergency Connectivity Fund

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 includes \$7.17 billion for the Connectivity Fund Emergency program. The ECF will provide funding for public and tribal libraries and K-12 schools purchase connected devices broadband internet connections for use off of library and school grounds by library patrons, students, teachers, and staff who otherwise do not have internet access.





STEM Kits Update

Beginning July 1, STEM kits will be available for check out again. These kits circulate to all libraries in the state to be used in Makerspaces, programming, STEM clubs, coding clubs, and other events to spread the love of STEM. From robots and chemistry to telescopes and lawn games, there is sure to be a STEM kit for every age, skill level, and interest.


North Dakota Library Marketing Group
