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Frequency Asked Questions about the Emergency Connectivity Fund

What Is the Emergency Connectivity Fund?

- The Emergency Connectivity Fund is a \$7.17 billion program funded by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 to help schools and libraries support remote learning. The Program will provide funding to schools and libraries for the reasonable costs of eligible equipment and services that can be provided to students, teachers, and library patrons who lack connected devices, such as laptop or tablet computers, and/or lack broadband access during the pandemic.
- The Federal Communications Commission unanimously adopted a Report and Order on May 10, 2021, establishing the rules and procedures for the <u>Emergency Connectivity</u> <u>Fund Program</u>.
- The Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) is the program administrator.

ND Library Coordinating Council Vacancies

The <u>ND Library Coordinating Council</u> (NDLCC) serves as the State Library's advisory board. The NDLCC assists with the creation and implementation of the Library Vision strategic plan, the awarding of Library Vision grants and serves as the external database review committee. The Governor appoints NDLCC members according to Century Code.

The State Library is accepting nominations to fill vacancies in the Public Library and At-Large Librarian seats. Both positions must be filled by a practicing North Dakota librarian; library staff at all levels are encouraged to apply.

Nominations, including self-nominations, may be sent to the NDSL Administrative email at ndsladmn@nd.gov by July 23. The State Library will compile the list of applicants and forward it to the Governor's office. Nominees will also need to complete an application found on the Governor's office website.



NASA@ My Library STEM Kits

There are now six NASA@ My Library STEM Kits for libraries to reserve:

- Be A NASA Detective focuses on activities and experiences that help patrons and library staff be more comfortable using tools of science and making predictions based on their observations.
- Expedition: Earth focuses on activities and experiences that teach patrons and library staff about the weather and magnification.



- Sun-Earth-Moon Connections focuses on activities and experiences that better help patrons understand their place in space, and how the Sun and Moon impact our planet.
- The Way The World Works studies engineering and mathematics.
- To The Moon and Beyond uses a telescope and/or binoculars to observe the Moon and other parts of the solar system.

Each kit comes with books, activities for all ages, and crafts. Beads, chenille sticks, crepe paper, paper plates, etc., are provided for crafts and are not expected to be returned. Please only use what you need, though.

WordPress Help - Themes

Many public libraries have a website through WordPress that was set up by the State Library. During the initial setup, we used a simple theme to get you started. If the current theme is not meeting the library's needs, there are many others from which to choose.



After logging in with your WordPress account, go to Appearance and click on Themes on the left-hand side of

the screen. This will bring you to a screen of recommended themes. If none of those look like they

will suit the library's needs, click on All Themes. On the right-hand side of the screen, you will see a box that says All, Free, and Premium. If you haven't purchased an upgraded plan, click on Free to see your available options.

If you see a theme that you are interested in, click on the three dots and click on Try & Customize or live demo to see how it would look. When you find the theme you like, click on Activate & Save.
