The Local Foods program promotes food grown, produced, or processed in our own communities.

The Local Foods program connects the producer to the consumer directly, creating opportunities to support local agriculture and build community. WordPress Help - Adding a .pdf to Your Website

This month, we're going to discuss two ways to add a .pdf to your library's WordPress website.

1. PDF as a link

To add a link that will take people to your .pdf, click on the location in your post/page where you would like the link, and then click on the plus sign in the upper left-hand corner. You can either select "File" under Media or type pdf in the search and click on "File." If the file has already been uploaded to WordPress, you can click on Media Library, select the file, and click Insert. If not, click on Upload, find the file, and click open. Although it may look like it has been embedded, it will only show up as a link with a Download button next to it. You can get rid of the download button by clicking next to the "Show download button" on the right-hand side.

2. Embedded PDF

To embed a .pdf, start by clicking on Media, which can be found on the left-hand side of the screen. If the .pdf isn't already on the media page, click on "Add New," find the .pdf, and click open. Select the .pdf you would like to add and click on Edit (right next to the Add new button). Find the URL, click on the Copy button, and then click Done. Next, you'll want to locate the page or post that you would like to add the .pdf to. This can be one that already exists, or you can create a new one. Once you know where you want to add the .pdf, either press CTRL+V or right-click and select Paste. It will show up as "Click to access [filename].pdf," but if you press Preview or Publish, you'll see that it has been embedded to your post or page.
