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ND Library and Technology Standards Writing Committee Members Needed

In collaboration with the North Dakota State Library, the North Dakota Department of Public Instruction (NDDPI) seeks qualified individuals from K-12 districts and schools and higher education institutions to serve as content specialists to review and revise the state's current K-12 Library and Technology content standards.

The standards development committee will review the 2012 library content standards and draft revisions to improve the structure and content. The committee will submit the revised library standards to the state superintendent for final approval and adoption of the new library standards to guide local curriculum development.

The content standards development process will begin in February 2022 and include approximately four separate meetings, concluding by Fall 2022.

Mindfulness

What is mindfulness?

According to mindful.org, mindfulness is "the basic human ability to be fully present, aware of where we are and what we're doing, and not overly reactive or overwhelmed by what's going on around us" (Getting, n.d.).


What are the benefits of mindfulness?

Benefits of mindfulness include decreased stress and anxiety, increased concentration and engagement, better sleep at night, better recognition of personal emotions, enhanced decision-making and problemsolving skills, increases in communicating feelings verbally, instead of physically, and increases in empathy and compassion (Cassie, 2017).

Why practice mindfulness in the library?

Mindfulness can be a great way for students (and educators) to recenter. It helps create calm in their minds and bodies and can assist in focusing on the task at hand. I know many of you, if not all, have experienced at least one student who just cannot keep focused. Maybe this child/preteen/teenager wants to touch friends? Maybe this individual wants to dominate group discussions? Maybe this person just seems to exist in their own little world? Whatever the action, mindfulness can be an excellent reaction!




Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Book Recommendation

The Person You Mean to Be: How Good People Fight Biasby Dolly Chugh

Many of us believe in equality, diversity, and inclusion. But how do we stand up for those values in our turbulent world? "The Person You Mean to Be" by Dolly Chugh is the smart, "semi-bold" person's guide to fighting for what you believe in. Dolly Chugh, a social psychologist and professor at the New York University Stern School of Business, reveals the surprising causes of inequality, grounded in the "psychology of good people."

Using her research findings in unconscious bias as well as work across psychology, sociology, economics, political science, and other disciplines, she offers practical tools to respectfully and effectively talk politics with family, to be a better colleague to people who don't look like you, and to avoid being a well-intentioned barrier to equality. Becoming that person we mean to be starts with a look at ourselves.



This title has been used frequently for book clubs with State Employees. If you are looking for a great book to help you start the journey of understanding bias and how to overcome it one step at a time, this book is for you. It is available through the North Dakota State Library and OverDrive/Libby, both as an e-book and e-audiobook.

ODIN Training is Now Available in Niche Academy

A new pathway was created in Niche Academy for librarians using the Polaris system, whether you are new to using the Polaris system or you need a review of the training received from the ODIN office.

The ODIN Polaris Training Pathway, which includes links to the ODIN trainings for the Acquisitions and Serials, Cataloging, Circulation, and Holds and ILL Modules, can be found under the ODIN Polaris: LEAP and PAC category. It includes video tutorials, online and printable instructional guides, links to user group archives, and canned demonstrations using the reports programs.

The ODIN Polaris: LEAP and PAC category also has two tutorials on Simply Reports and a pathway for the Public Access Catalog (PAC). This pathway will walk you through using the catalog, which you can access from the North Dakota State Library homepage.



As of January 1, 2022, this resource will go back to being only available in the library. Patrons who have been accessing Ancestry Library Edition at home will lose their access at that time.
