Libby also comes with new features, like:

- Compatibility with Apple CarPlay, Android Auto, and Sonos speakers
- Extra learning and entertainment resources, like Universal Class




West Fargo library program

Embedding Videos on Your WordPress Website

Did you record a fun summer reading program, and now you want to post it on your website? Are you looking for a fun way to capture your audience's attention? Try including a video on your WordPress website!


Although you can upload videos directly to your WordPress website, it is not recommended. Instead, you should upload the video to a video hosting service, such as YouTube or Vimeo. Once you have the video uploaded, click on "Share" underneath the video and copy the link. Go to your WordPress website page, click on the location where you would like to embed the video, and paste the link. Your video will automatically display in that spot.

"If You Tell: A True Story of Murder, Family Secrets, and the Unbreakable Bond of Sisterhood" by Gregg Olsen

After more than a decade, when sisters Nikki, Sami, and Tori Knotek hear the word mom, it claws like an eagle's talons, triggering memories that have been their secret since childhood. Until now. For years, behind the closed doors of their farmhouse in Raymond, Washington, their sadistic mother, Shelly, subjected her girls to unimaginable abuse, degradation, torture, and psychic terrors. Through it all, Nikki, Sami, and Tori developed a defiant bond that made them far less vulnerable than Shelly imagined. Even as others were drawn into their mother's dark and perverse web, the sisters found the strength and courage to escape an escalating nightmare that culminated in multiple murders.
