Authentic Diversity: How to Change the Workplace for Good

For the fifth EDI article, I want to concentrate on a book found in NDSL's collection: Authentic Diversity: How to Change the Workplace for Good by Michelle Silverthorn.

Michelle Silverthorn is a black, cis, straight woman. She's a graduate of Princeton University and the University of Michigan Law School and an organizational diversity expert and keynote speaker. She is the founder and CEO of Inclusion Nation, where she works with clients in various industries to create inclusive spaces focused on equity, belonging, and authenticity.

Silverthorn challenges leaders to take their institutions from diverse to inclusive. Let's be honest, diversity in much of North Dakota looks different than diversity in New York state, California, or Georgia. (Although this is changing as time goes along.) That's ok! The important part is working with the employee population YOUR library has by helping everyone feel welcomed, heard, and valued.

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WebJunction Highlight: Mental Health and Suicide Prevention for Veterans, Service Members, and Their Families Submitted by Al Peterson

WebJunction is collaborating with the Veterans Health Administration and Legal Services Corporation to promote free and reliable services, information, and resources on suicide prevention.

Suicide is a national public health issue. It impacts people from all walks of life, regardless of whether or not they have served in the military; however, the suicide rate among Veterans in 2019 was 52% higher than non-Veteran adults in the U.S., according to the 2021 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report. It is estimated that Veteran suicides represent approximately 22% of all suicide deaths in the U.S.

Libraries are well-positioned to provide information and referral services to connect Veterans and members of military communities with Veterans Health Administration programs and initiatives that address risk and protective factors for suicidal behaviors.

Book Club Kit - "Flygirl" by Sherri L. Smith

All Ida Mae Jones wants to do is fly. Her daddy was a pilot, and years after his death, she feels closest to him when she's in the air. But as a young black woman in 1940s Louisiana, she knows the sky is off-limits to her - until America enters World War II, and the Army forms the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP). Ida has a chance to fulfill her dream if she's willing to use her light skin to pass as a white girl. She wants to fly more than anything, but Ida soon learns that denying one's self and family is a heavy burden, and ultimately it's not what you do but who you are that's most important.



This kit comes with ten paperback books, a discussion guide, and a sign-in sheet.
