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## Library Vision Grants Opening in July

The grant webinar for our July 2023 round of Library Vision grants is now available on the <u>NDSL YouTube page</u>. This webinar covers grants for makerspaces, programming, and collection development for a new collection. Attendance or asynchronous viewing of the webinar is a requirement for receiving a Library Vision grant. Guidelines for each grant are available on our <u>grants webpage</u>.

When preparing to apply for a Library Vision grant, we recommend using the available grant template and preparing your grant application in a Word document or other word processing software. If you would like feedback before submission, please send it in a Word document to the e-mail below. This will make it easier to add comments in the margins. Once your grant is ready for submission, copy and paste your information from your template into Counting Opinions. All official submissions must be made in Counting Opinions - a link can be found on the grants webpage. If you need your login information for Counting Opinions, please contact me early in the process to make sure you can get into your account.

### **E-rate Documents Retention Overview**

All E-Rate program participants, whether they are applicants, service providers, or consortia, are required to maintain documentation that demonstrates compliance with the statutory or regulatory requirements for all E-Rate program purchases of service and equipment for a period of 10 years after the latter of the last day of the applicable funding year or the service delivery deadline for the funding request. This would include any documents such as the pre-bidding process, bidding process, contract, application process, invoices and forms, and rules compliance.

For most of the libraries involved in E-rate consortiums, you need to retain the Letters of Agency and Form 479.

If your library applied on its own in the past, make sure you are retaining all pertinent application documents from the last ten years.

#### Standards and Your Library's Website

You may have noticed that the <u>North Dakota Library Coordinating Council</u> <u>Standards for Public Libraries</u> document includes portions regarding what your library's website should include.

In order to achieve the Developing Level, which affects your eligibility for some Library Vision Grants, your website must include, at a minimum, your services, programs, hours, contact information, location, and the online library resources provided by your library and the State Library.

In order to achieve the Excelling Level, your library must also include your library's policies (collection development, patron conduct, etc.).



### **Outdoor Kit: Croquet**

Croquet is a family-friendly game and great for honing the entire family's math and science skills. Practice keeping score, measuring probability, and mentally calculating angles, distance, force, and momentum. Games help develop new brain cells and assist in number and shape recognition, grouping, counting, visual perception, hand-eye coordination, and manual dexterity. Additionally, children can be taught important social skills such as verbal communication, sharing, and taking turns by playing games.



Each kit contains one bag, six mallets, nine gates, six balls, two stakes, and a folder with an inventory, a question sheet, and instructions.
