## **EBSCO Renames Reference Databases**

EBSCO will soon be making a slight name change to its school reference databases. Beginning on or around March 1, the reference database names will have the term "Center" replaced with "Source." This change affects two databases within the Minitex package. Science Reference Center will become Science Reference Source, and Points of View Reference Center will become Points of View Reference Source.

#### EBSCO states:

This change reflects our efforts to enhance the global appeal of our products and make them more accessible and intuitive for users around the world. "Source" is a more universally understood term and better aligns with user expectations. "Source" also signifies the rich and diverse range of materials available in our databases, encouraging students, educators and patrons to view our resources as a primary destination for their research and information needs. 


## **Newspapers**

According to the National Archives and Records Administration, "microfilm is a low-cost, reliable, long-term, standardized image storage medium," which is why it is still relevant in today's digital world.

However, manually scrolling though rolls of microfilm is not effective for users. The ability to keyword search is paramount in the digital era. Thankfully, there have been digitization projects over the last several years that have brought microfilm into the 21st century, and these efforts have also included North Dakota.

# **Book Club Kit: "The Royal Nanny" by Karen Harper**
