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REPORT

The State Library is mandated by state and federal law to insure equal access to information for all citizens of North Dakota. To do this, the State Library not only serves people directly, but makes every effort to help libraries develop at the local level and serves as a coordinating agent for statewide library services.

In order to develop quality library service for the citizens of North Dakota, the State Library works with institutional, public and academic libraries to improve information services in these libraries, helps plan continuing education experiences for librarians and conducts research to support the plans for future projects of libraries in North Dakota.

To help plan library development in North Dakota, the Governor's Advisory Council on Libraries, made up of both librarians and citizens, is appointed each year to advise the State Librarian and the Director of Institutions of the information needs in North Dakota.

The State Library is also a resource library for school, public, academic and special libraries. As a resource center, the State Library provides special materials such as filmstrips for children's programs in school and public libraries, large print books for persons with visual problems, and books that are too specialized or expensive for public and school libraries to purchase. All of these materials are also available to walk-in patrons and persons who do not live in a community with a library. Since the State Library is the primary information source for state agencies, the book, cassette, and journal collections try to reflect the professional needs and interests of persons working for the State of North Dakota.

The key role of the State Library is coordinator of a statewide interlibrary loan service. To that end, the State Library maintains a record of the books and magazines of all the academic and major public libraries. Thus, if a public library does not have a particular book, the request is sent to the State Library. If a staff member at the State Library cannot find the book in the State Library's collection or in any of the collections of other North Dakota libraries, the request is sent out of state. An agreement is signed by the Director of Institutions and the Minnesota Board of Higher Education for this service.

Library Services

Liberty Memorial Building - The highlight of the 1981-83 biennium was the State Library's move from the basement of the Randal Building to the newly remodeled Liberty Memorial Building in the summer of 1982. The building was beautifully restored to its 1920's beauty by highlighting the carved ceilings and refinishing the extensive woodwork throughout the building. The Liberty Memorial Building is not only elegant but very functional and easily accessible to state government employees and the public. The reading area occupies a full floor with areas for individual research and audio visual room for previewing films, filmstrips and microfiche. To increase services to persons working in state government, the hours of the library were changed to 8-6 Monday through Thursday, rather than closing at 5 from Monday through Thursday. The top floor of the building houses 3+1 meeting rooms for use by state agencies. Since their completion in December of 1982 over 2300 people from 32 state agencies have taken advantage of these rooms.

It is a building that the whole state can take pride in. To encourage people, particularly school groups, to get acquainted with the services of the State Library and to admire the Liberty Memorial Building, a volunteer program was established to give tours of the building.

Government Services - The increased visibility of the State Library since moving to the Capitol Grounds has dramatically increased the service given to persons working in state government. Tours for state departments have been an on-going event since moving into the new quarters and requests from state government persons have increased from a monthly average of 50 in the Randal Building to 171 on the Capitol Grounds. The State Library's Government Services Division also has a responsibility to see that the information concerning North Dakota government gets to the people. To this end the State Library and the Legislative Council promoted a program to see that libraries that wished to have the material would receive all bills, journals and the calendars from the 1981 Legislative Session. Four workshops were conducted throughout the state to insure that librarians would know how to use the materials. Evaluations from the project indicate that the Legislative documents were used and appreciated by those communities.

<u>Library Services</u> - OCLC Network Expands - OCLC is an international computerized network that links the collections of 7,000 libraries by author and title. During the 1981-83 biennium, 5 libraries in North Dakota have been added to the OCLC network in the state making a grand total of 22 North Dakota libraries in the system. OCLC is primarily used as a cataloging tool in libraries but as retrospective collections are added to the data base, North Dakota libraries are able to locate books that are in other libraries in the state without going through the State Library. This enables the State Library to concentrate on libraries who do not have OCLC and areas of North Dakota without library service.

Inservice - As the world's knowledge base expands, the level of sophistication of information needs has risen in North Dakota. To meet these needs, the State Library has begun an internal on-going continuing education program to upgrade the information and reference skills of State Library staff.

Statewide Library Development - The State Library has continued the joint sponsor-ship of, with the North Dakota Library Association, spring workshops for public librarians and trustees each year in two locations in the state. The 1982 program included these topics: Health and Wellness Materials for Public Libraries and Story-telling. The 1983 workshop had an intensive course in reference sources for small and medium-sized libraries and publicity activities for libraries. In the 1981-83 biennium, the State Library also began the Trustee School which has been so successful that plans are being made to expand the topics and hold the school in four locations around the state in 1984. Aimed at the beginning trustee, the two trustee schools have taught library law, statewide networking and library budgeting.

Advisory Council - Under the sponsorship of the North Dakota Governor's Advisory Council on Libraries, the Public Library Planning Committee published North Dakota Library Services to Young Adults and Children, which offers guidelines for service to children for both school and public libraries.

Books by Mail - In January, 1983, the State Library began an experimental "Books by Mail" program in ten counties which do not have library service. This service is contracted with the Grand Forks Public Library which sends a catalog of popular

paperback books to each household in the following counties: Barnes, Benson, Billings, Bottineau, Burke, Cavalier, Dunn, Fremont, Grand Forks, Grant, Mountrail, Nelson, Oliver, Pembina, Sargent, Sheridan, Slope, Steele, Walsh and Ward. It is hoped that this minimal library service will not only publicize the services of the State Library, but also be an incentive to these counties to contract with nearby libraries for more total information service.

Blind and Physically Handicapped Service - Blind/or physically handicapped North Dakotans who cannot read ordinary print material or those who are learning-disabled due to an organic dysfunction, receive library service through a contract with the Dakotas Regional Library for the Handicapped at Pierre, South Dakota. Unlike other North Dakotans who are able to use their local library or the State Library, these persons cannot read conventional media because they cannot see its print or hold it in their hands due to physical disability. They read "talking books" - books and magazines that are recorded on flexible disc or cassette tape. All material - books, magazines, reference services, newsletters and equipment - is loaned free of charge and sent postage-free through the mail. In August, 1981, a .50 FTE consultant was added to the staff of the North Dakota State Library to improve service to North Dakota patrons and to increase usage of the library by North Dakotans. Only 810 North Dakotans were using the library at that time. From August, 1981 to June, 1983, there was an increase of 437 North Dakota patrons of the library facilities. (810 in August, 1981; 1, 247 in June, 1983). Much of the increase can be attributed to the outreach and promotional work done to inform North Dakotans of the service. Services to patrons of the Dakotas Regional Library for the Handicapped have also been increased in this biennium. North Dakota volunteers have been recruited to record textbooks for blind and/or physically handicapped school children and to record material on or by North Dakotans. The consultant is also working with state departments and public radio personnel to initiate a radio "talking book and newspaper" reading service in the state.

Library Legislation

Federal Legislation - Federal Funds - The State Library programs and services are heavily dependent on funding from Library Services and Construction Act funds, so it was greatly appreciated that North Dakota's two senators and congressman were of assistance in maintaining a consistent level of funding. In the Spring of 1983, Congress passed the Emergency Jobs Act, P.L.98.8. Included in this bill was \$193,636 to be spent on library construction and renovation in North Dakota libraries. Applications for this grant were submitted to the State Library and the Governor's Advisory Council on Libraries to be acted on in the summer of 1983.

State Aid to Public Libraries - State Aid to Public Libraries was funded at the 1981 level of 1.1 million dollars. First passed in the 1979 Legislature, State Aid has been beneficial to both large and small libraries. Grant funds are primarily used for purchasing library materials (49%) and for salaries and wages to staff libraries for longer hours and beginning new programs (45%). One of the primary advantages of State Aid to Public Libraries is that a local government must maintain the same level of support for three consecutive years. Because of this stipulation, communities have not only been reluctant to cut funds to libraries, but have even increased their level of support for libraries. In the April, 1982 election, Jamestown voted to raise their mill levy from three to seven mills and Williston voted a 1.4 million dollar bond issue for a new building. In May, 1983, the city of Mandan voted to raise their mill levy from five to seven mills. State grants have also been a stimulus for several counties and cities to form joint libraries and contract for service in order to take advantage of a broader funding base. The city of Williston and Williams County have formed a joint library board giving the citizens of Williams County the benefit of not only bookmobile service, but an In-Wats line and access to a wider range of books. Mountrail County contracts with Ward County for these same services, plus a booksby-mail program. - 214 -
