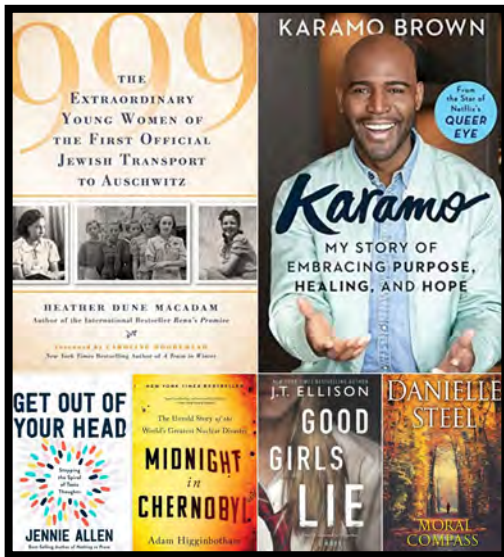

Consumer Health Complete

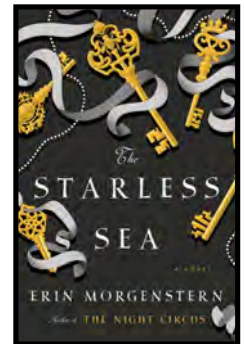

The Starless Sea by Erin Morgenstern

Everything changes for Zachary Ezra Rawlins when he chances upon a library book while browsing the stacks and discovers it contains a chapter describing a mysterious event from his childhood. In seeking to unlock its secrets, he becomes subsumed in an increasingly fantastic world of librarian detective work, literary masquerades, secret societies, underground book collectors, and those rare and beautiful souls for whom storytelling is a love supreme. Morgenstern interweaves excerpts from impossible library books with the unfurling of Zachary's story in hauntingly poetic fashion. *The Starless Sea* is literary fiction rife with everything you love, including surveillance, time travel, pirates, bees, and romance with the moon. While stories about storytellers and library books about library books may be a mite too meta for some, Morgenstern pulls off the conceit with beauty, wit, insight, and verve.
