Talking Book Services

Did you know that The National Library Service (NLS) has designed a digital player for listening to NLS recorded digital books?

Each Talking Book patron receives one digital player, free on loan, to listen to books loaned by the North Dakota Talking Book Library. Technical support and replacement are provided for these players.

Headphones can be issued to patrons who require them for reading talking books where speakers are not permitted, as in nursing homes and hospitals.

Digital books (DB) are on a flash memory cartridge about the size of a cassette tape that fits into the front of the digital player. One end of the cartridge has a round finger hole, so the cartridge can easily be extracted from the player. The cartridge is inserted into the digital player in the opening above the handle of the player. It is not necessary to rewind the cartridge before returning it to the library.

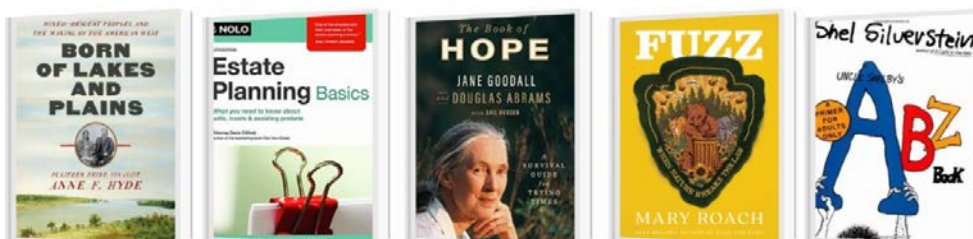

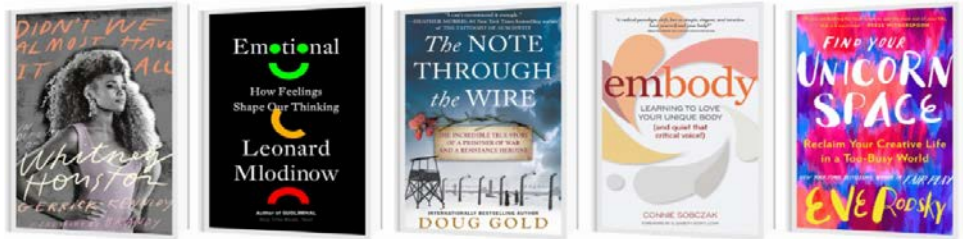

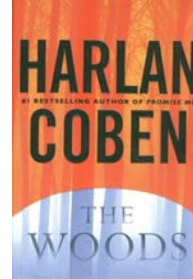

Book Review

"The Woods" by Harlan Coben

Four teens at summer camp disappear in the woods - two were found murdered, but the others were not found.

Twenty years later, a recent murder victim has items on him linked to what happened back at the camp. One of the teens who were at the camp when this happened is asked to identify the body. He doesn't recognize the body until after seeing an item that was found on him, which brings back the memory of his sister, one of the missing campers who was never found. He starts investigating what really happened the night the teens disappeared and reconnects with another camper who was there at that time too.
