New Loan Periods For State Library Items

Beginning September 1, the North Dakota State Library will begin circulating all materials in the collection for eight weeks. Patrons can have up to 20 items checked out.

"The State Library is updating our circulation periods so that it is easier for patrons to utilize our collection," says North Dakota State Librarian Mary Soucie. "No matter what type of material they check out, the item will be due back in eight weeks. We recognize that sometimes that still might not be long enough, so we are allowing one renewal as well. We believe this will better meet the needs of the library community, state agencies and North Dakota citizens across the state."

Whether you are checking out regular print books, large print books, state documents, book club kits, or any of the other items from the State Library's collection, you will get eight weeks to enjoy them.

Electronic materials available through the Libby app or on OverDrive will still have a checkout period of 14 or 21 days, depending on your settings.

Learn more about the Artemis program and NASA's plans for a new generation of crewed spaceflight by completing the activity badges in this reading and activity challenge!




Team Management and Leadership

Are you looking for an online library resource specifically geared toward the needs of K-2 learners? PebbleGo helps your child learn foundational research skills and provides critical early-reader support with audio voiceovers and text highlighting.

The easy navigation makes it inviting for kids to discover new information. With features like videos and fun games, kids are kept engaged and learning skills and fun facts.

Your State Library card gives you access to two PebbleGo modules – Animals and Biographies.

The Animals module includes information on the habitat, food, life cycle, and fun facts about amphibians, birds, fish, insects and spiders, invertebrates, mammals, and reptiles. There is also information on dinosaurs, pets and farm animals, animal classification, and more.

The biography module includes information on the early life, life's work, later years, and contributions of actors, artists, astronauts, athletes, explorers, history makers, scientists, and more.


Book Review

"Dare To Lead: Brave Work, Tough Conversations, Whole Hearts" by Brené Brown

"Dare to Lead" is a thought-provoking, leadership-shaping book written by the passionate, feisty author Brené Brown. She affirms that people aren't necessarily born leaders, but rather, anyone can grow to be a leader.

Brown recognizes that everyone has vulnerabilities, including herself. She addresses those vulnerabilities by leading the reader through myths they have grown to accept and the shame and guilt that drives potential leaders to be less than they really are.



Brown teaches all leaders the value of empathy, how to momentarily set aside their own need to be heard, and instead empower others and, in doing so, empower themselves.

This book shares, what I believe, to be some naked truths about the human psyche. As I read this book, I felt uncomfortable as I recognized and worked through my own shortcomings to grow as a person and leader. Brown uses language that is raw at times. But don't allow that to cloud the messages we all need to hear.
