Link Rot

Have you ever heard of “link rot”? You may not have heard of the term, but you’ve likely encountered it. On a website, have you ever encountered a broken link (a link that didn’t work or didn’t go anywhere)? Did you get a “404 error” message or something similar?

This is link rot. According to [Wikipedia](#), it is the “phenomenon of hyperlinks tending over time to cease to point to their originally targeted file, web page, or server due to that resource being relocated to a new address or becoming permanently unavailable.”

What is the average lifespan of a webpage? Estimates vary, but they are all short. In 1997, a [report](#) published in Scientific American claimed 44 days. In 2001, a [study](#) published in IEEE Computer claimed 75 days. In 2003, a Washington Post [article](#) claimed 100 days. Ironically, two of these studies have succumbed to link rot and are no longer available at their original location.

Spanish Lessons for Librarians

[Mango Languages](#), an online language learning website provided by the North Dakota State Library, offers over 70 language courses to learn and practice a foreign language.

In addition to the learning modules, many languages have a list of specialty units. The Spanish (Latin American) course has a unit specifically geared toward library workers called Spanish for Librarians.

The lessons in this unit address common encounters for librarians working in the public, including phrases for reference staff, how to assist Spanish-speaking patrons with accessing resources, how to help them with job searching, and how to let our Spanish-speaking patrons know about activities and happenings at the library. These self-paced language lessons can go a long way and bridge that communication gap between you and Spanish-speaking patrons.

Within Universal Class, there are over 100 classes specifically on Entrepreneurship. Topics include accounting, marketing, project management, small business management, and other career development courses.

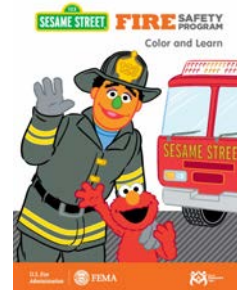
