This month, we are highlighting the Vietnamese language, which you can learn at no cost through Mango Languages. This course includes 10 chapters with 70 lessons to teach you small talk, food and drink, transportation and payment, etc.

These lessons involve a mix of listening and reading activities in an all-in-one interface. There are critical-thinking activities, memory-building exercises, grammar notes to explain the underlying grammatical structure, and culture notes to apply cultural context to what you're learning, which creates a more profound understanding.

### 2024 Rob-See-Co Rural Library Grant Announced

### Rob-See-Co

Rob-See-Co is excited to announce the second year of the Agnes Robinson Rural Library Grant program. The overwhelming response to the program in 2023 underscores the critical need for funding in rural libraries, prompting Rob-See-Co to establish it as an annual initiative. The grant's namesake and Rob Robinson's grandmother, Agnes Robinson, was a dedicated supporter of the Waterloo, Nebraska, rural library and rural libraries in general.

Rural libraries in the Rob-See-Co footprint (states of CO, IA, IL, IN, KS, MD, MI, MN, ND, NE, OH, OK, PA, SD, TX, and WI) will be emailed a letter with instructions and guidelines for applying for this year's grant dollars. This year, the **grant application** is online - aiming to make the process easier and more efficient.

Applications will be due June 30th, 2024, and recipients will be announced October 1, 2024.

### 2024 Climate Action Symposium Survey

Our friends at the Space Science Institute (leads of the Solar Eclipse Activities for Libraries program) are seeking your input for a symposium meant to begin to identify the role of public libraries in climate action.

This survey is to inform the design of the 2024 Climate Action Symposium: Exploring Collaborations with Libraries, Community-Based Organizations, and Public Health Agencies

The symposium is part of a project (Building Resilient Communities) funded by the National Science Foundation and led by the Space Science Institute and its STAR Library Network. Project partners include OCLC WebJunction, University of North Carolina Greensboro, and Interactive Learning Dynamics. The focus of the survey is on public library STEM learning programs and activities related to climate change science, climate change's impacts on public health, and community sustainability and/or resiliency. The estimated time needed to complete this survey is 9 minutes. All information you provide will be completely confidential. Data will only be shared in aggregate through reports and papers — no personally identifiable information will be shared.
