N.D.A.G. Letter to Freise (Oct. 19, 1987)

Dear Mr. Freise:

Thank you for your letter of September 4, 1987, regarding the pre-hospital emergency medical services system. You have inquired whether North Dakota Administrative Code § 50-03-01-12 conflicts with N.D. Admin. Code § 50-03-03-03.

N.D. Admin Code ch. 50-03-01 regulates the practice of a physician's trained assistant. In general, that chapter identifies and restricts what a physician's trained assistant may do, and it limits the authority of the physician to the delegation of duties to the assistant. N.D. Admin. Code § 50-03-01-12 provides, however, that N.D. Admin. Code ch. 50-03-01 shall not limit a physician's authority to delegate certain acts, tasks, or functions.

50-03-01-02. PHYSICIAN'S DELEGATION TO QUALIFIED PERSON NOT RESTRICTED. Nothing in this chapter shall limit or prevent any physician from delegating to a qualified person any acts, tasks, or functions which are otherwise permitted by law or established by custom.

(Emphasis supplied.)

The exception in N.D. Admin. Code § 50-03-01-12 relieves the physician of the restrictions and limitations found in N.D. Admin. Code ch. 50-03-01 only when a delegation to a qualified individual is otherwise allowed by law or custom. This exception applies only to N.D. Admin. Code ch. 50-03-01, and does not relieve any individual from the requirement of any other law or regulation.

N.D. Admin. Code § 50-03-03-31, on the other hand, requires that individuals demonstrate their proficiency as an emergency medical technician. Thus, a physician is not permitted to delegate certain acts involving emergency medical services unless that individual meets the requirements of N.D. Admin. Code ch. 50-03-03.

N.D. Admin. Code §§ 50-03-01-12 and 50-03-03-03 are not in conflict. Individuals must meet the requirements of N.D. Admin. Code § 50-03-03-03 in order to act as emergency medical technicians, and this requirement is not altered by the language of N.D. Admin. Code § 50-03-01-12.
