#### --QUESTION PRESENTED--

Whether any power and authority possessed by the governor may be delegated to the lieutenant governor.

## --ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OPINION--

It is my opinion that all power and authority given to the governor, except those responsibilities explicitly reserved to the governor under the Constitution, may be delegated to the lieutenant governor.

#### --ANALYSIS--

Article V, Section 7 of the Constitution of North Dakota states, in part, as follows:

The powers and duties of the Lieutenant Governor shall be to serve as president of the Senate, and he may, when the Senate is equally divided, vote on procedural matters, and on substantive matters if his vote would be decisive. Additional duties shall be prescribed by the Governor.

In <u>State ex rel.</u>, <u>Peterson vs. Olson</u>, 307 N.W.2d 528 (N.D. 1981), the North Dakota Supreme Court held that the governor has the authority under this constitutional section to delegate to the lieutenant governor all powers which the governor possesses with the exception of those reserved especially to the governor by the Constitution. Apart from those duties explicitly reserved to the Governor under the Constitution, the Governor has the authority to delegate duties to the Lieutenant Governor. 307 N.W.2d 528, 533.

Article V of the Constitution contains those specific powers provided to the governor. Thus, the governor is able to delegate to the lieutenant governor all of those powers and authority he possesses with the exception of those listed under Article V. Specifically, the following authority cannot be delegated to the lieutenant governor:

- 1. Authority to act as Commander-in-Chief of the military and naval forces;
- 2. Authority to convene the Legislature;

- 3. Authority to give a State of the State message to the Legislature;
- 4. Authority to grant reprieves, commutations, and pardons;
- 5. Authority to be a member of the Board of Pardons;
- 6. Authority to fill vacant public offices by appointment where statutory or constitutional provisions do not provide for a replacement;
- 7. Authority to call special elections;
- 8. Authority to approve or disapprove Legislative bills;
- 9. Authority to disapprove appropriation items; and
- 10. Authority to be a member of the Board of University and School Lands.
