WHAT IS KIDS COUNT?

KIDS COUNT, a project of the Annie E. Casey Foundation, seeks to track the status of children across the United States and within individual states. The national KIDS COUNT program publishes an annual *KIDS COUNT Data Book* ranking state performance on 10 indicators reflecting the educational, social, economic, and physical well-being of children. The national program also produces related publications addressing concerns that affect child outcomes across states. State KIDS COUNT programs publish yearly reports detailing child well-being on a substate geography level (e.g., county or city). Both national and state KIDS COUNT programs strive to document conditions affecting children in the areas where they live so that national, state, and local decision-making can more effectively address children's needs through sound policy creation. WHAT IS NORTH DAKOTA KIDS COUNT?

North Dakota KIDS COUNT, sponsored by the Annie E. Casey Foundation, has been examining critical issues for North Dakota children and families since 1994. The mission of North Dakota KIDS COUNT is to provide accurate, current data on child well-being in order to inform local and state discussions about how to secure better futures for all of North Dakota's children. North Dakota KIDS COUNT offers public presentations, networking, a website, and several publication series. WHAT IS THE NORTH DAKOTA KIDS COUNT FACT BOOK?

The *North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book*, now in its 15th year, is an annual publication that provides state, regional, and county profiles consisting of multiple indicators nested within six components of child well-being. Beginning in 2005, the *Fact Book* became an electronic publication only, thus bound versions are no longer produced.

Previously, the profiles presented in the *Fact Book* were based on seven components of child well-being, with Child Care as a separate component. This year, in an effort to coordinate with the national KIDS COUNT program, the child care indicators are now located within the Education and Early Care component. In addition, some of the titles used to identify the six components have been modified. See page 7 for these modifications.

REPORT FORMAT

The 2009 North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book is divided into three main sections:

1. Summary and Findings provide a summary of trends and an overview of findings for multiple indicators nested within six components of child well-being. The six components include:

> Demographics Family and Community Economic Well-Being Education and Early Care Health Safety and Risky Behaviors

- 2. State, Regional, and County Profiles present the most recent available information (at the time of publication) for the six components of child well-being. Separate three-page profiles are provided for the state, the state's eight planning regions, and the 53 counties in North Dakota. Actual numbers of children or events are presented along with percentages that allow county-to-county and region-to-region comparisons. Data presented in the state profile are repeated in each county and regional profile for easy comparison.
- 3. Definitions and Data Sources supply explanations and indicator definitions along with information sources for respective data. Readers are strongly encouraged to use these definitions for clarification and reference for the data provided.



MODIFICATIONS

The following modifications were made to the *Fact Book* report format and to data indicator definitions in this year's publication:

- 1. In an effort to coordinate with the national KIDS COUNT program, the seven components of child well-being previously presented in the profile section have been reduced to six components in the 2009 *Fact Book*. The Child Care component has been removed and the indicators previously contained in the Child Care component are now located in the Education and Early Care component.
- 2. In addition to the rearrangement of the child care indicators, the component previously titled Population is now titled Demographics; Family Composition is now Family and Community; Economic Condition is now Economic Well-Being; and Children at Risk is now Safety and Risky Behaviors.
- 3. The age indicators in the Demographics component have been expanded to include Ages 0 to 2, Age 3, Ages 4 to 5, Ages 6 to 12, Age 13, and Ages 14 to 17.
- 4. A new indicator, Total Births to Teens Ages 12 to 19, has been added to the Demographics component.
- 5. A new indicator, Total Births to All Unmarried Women (regardless of age) has been added to the Family and Community component. Total Births to Unmarried Teens Ages 12 to 19 has been moved from the Health component and placed in the Family and Community component.
- 6. The Medicaid Recipients Ages 0 to 20 indicator has been moved from the Economic Well-Being component and placed in the Health component. A new indicator, Child Care Assistance Recipients Ages 0 to 13, has been added to the Economic Well-Being component.
- 7. Two new indicators have been added to the Health component: Uninsured Children Ages 0 to 18 Below 200% of Poverty and Children Ages 0 to 18 Enrolled in Healthy Steps.
- 8. Five new indicators based on ACT college-readiness scores have been added to the Education component: % of ACT-Tested High School Graduates Ready for College English, Math, Reading, Science, and All Four Subject Areas.
- 9. Head Start enrollment and eligibility indicators, previously reported in the Education component, have been removed from the *Fact Book* due to the inability to consistently retrieve county-level data. However, state-level data for Head Start and Early Head Start (i.e., enrollment, staff characteristics, children and family characteristics, and services provided) are available through the North Dakota KIDS COUNT website at http://www.ndkidscount.org/.

LIMITATIONS

Overall, indicators have been chosen on the basis of their availability by county, their ability to convey broad elements of child well-being, the extent to which they provide for common interpretation, the possibility of their availability over time, their usefulness as a tool to track long-term trends in child well-being, and the validity of data sources.

It must be noted that not all children affected by a particular condition are reported to or identified by the proper authorities, nor are they all enrolled in an appropriate service program. Therefore, caution must be exercised in concluding these data represent the actual number of children whose lives may be touched by a given situation.

The 2009 North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book data include American Indian children living outside American Indian tribal areas in all indicators. American Indian children living within tribal areas are included in all indicators with the exception of Child Abuse and Neglect Reports and Suspected Victims of Child Abuse and Neglect (including situations in which services are required). WIC data exclude the Fort Berthold Reservation and the Standing Rock Reservation. Juvenile court referral data exclude tribal court referrals (see map on page 19 for tribal areas in North Dakota).

North Dakota KIDS COUNT gathers and organizes, but does not generate, the statistical information contained in the *Fact Book*.

SUMMARY AND FINDINGS



Examining critical issues for North Dakota children and families







DEMOGRAPHICS

From 2000 to 2007, five North Dakota counties saw at least a 40 percent loss in the number of youth ages 0 to 17.

- U.S. Census Bureau, Population Division



- In 2007, children ages 0 to 17 comprised 22.3 percent of North Dakota's total population, compared to 25.0 percent in 2000 and 27.5 percent in 1990. Statewide, these children numbered 142,809 in 2007, an 11.2 percent decline from 160,849 in 2000 and an 18.6 percent decline from 175,385 in 1990.
- The proportion of North Dakota children ages 0 to 17 in 2007 ranged from a low of 14.6 percent in Sheridan County to a high of 35.2 percent in Sioux County. From 1990 through 2000, five of North Dakota's 53 counties saw growth in the number of children (Cass, Burleigh, Rolette, Sioux, and Benson); from 2000 to 2007, only one county, Cass, showed growth.
- Among all states, North Dakota had the 8th lowest percentage of children ages 0 to 17 in 2007 at 22.3 percent. The percentage of children ranged from a low of 21.1 percent in Vermont to a high of 30.9 percent in Utah.
- Due to a consistent increase in births during the past few years, the number of children ages 0 to 5 in North Dakota has grown modestly since 2003. Conversely, the number of children ages 6 and older continues to decrease.
- The number of births in North Dakota declined consistently throughout the 1980s and 1990s, reaching a low of 7,635 in 1999. After a few years of little change, the number of births in North Dakota increased an average of 2.4 percent per year from 2001 through 2007, rising to 8,818.
- Births to North Dakota teenagers ages 12 to 19 totaled 699 in 2007, which is 7.9 percent of all births statewide. This proportion is down from 9.8 percent in 1998.
- Though white children comprised the majority of children ages 0 to 18 statewide in 2007 (87.3 percent), their numbers declined 11.6 percent from 2000 to 2007 (150,812 to 133,334). During the same time, the number of American Indian children, North Dakota's largest minority group, grew 3.1 percent (13,522 to 13,939). The state's smallest minority groups saw much larger percentage gains. From 2000 to 2007, the number of Hispanic children (of any race) increased 30.7 percent (3,377 to 4,414), the number of Asian children increased 35.7 percent (1,311 to 1,779), and the number of African American children increased 63.6 percent (2,248 to 3,678).

FAMILY AND COMMUNITY

- The majority of all North Dakota children ages 0 to 17 live with at least one of their parents. According to Census 2000, 75.8 percent of North Dakota children live with both parents and 19.1 percent live with a single parent. The remaining 5.1 percent live with other relatives (e.g., grandparent), non-relatives (e.g., foster parents), by themselves or with a spouse/unmarried partner, or in a group facility. Current state-level 2007 data suggest that the proportion of North Dakota children living by themselves or with someone other than their parent has grown to 7.5 percent (to be 90 percent certain, this amount could be +/-0.8) (U.S. Census Bureau, 2005-2007 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates, Table B090006, http://factfinder.census.gov).
- The number of North Dakota children living in foster care totaled 2,134 in 2008. These children represent 1.4 percent of all children ages 0 to 18 statewide, a proportion that has changed little over the past seven years.
- Most North Dakota children live with their mothers (whether she is married or single), and most North Dakota mothers work. In 2000, 90.1 percent of all North Dakota children lived with both parents or with a single mother, the largest proportion in the nation. In addition, the proportion of North Dakota mothers (with children ages 0 to 17) in the labor force was 81.2 percent in 2000, the 2nd highest proportion nationwide. The proportion of working mothers is slightly smaller for mothers with young children ages 0 to 5 (76.1 percent), but rises to 84.9 percent for mothers with older children (ages 6 to 17). Nationally, 69.1 percent of mothers with children ages 0 to 17 were in the labor force in 2000. Current national and state-level 2007 data indicate that these proportions have changed little since 2000 (U.S. Census Bureau, 2005-2007 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates, Table B23003, http://factfinder.census.gov).
- Nearly one-third of all North Dakota births in 2007 were to unmarried women (32.5 percent). This proportion has risen consistently over the past several years, up from 22.9 percent in 1994.
- Most of the births to unmarried women in 2007 were to women ages 20 or older; 21.6 percent were to teenagers. Births to unmarried teens ages 12 to 19 in North Dakota totaled 618 in 2007, 7.0 percent of all births statewide. This proportion has changed little since the early 1990s.

- Approximately one in five births to unmarried women in North Dakota were to teenagers in 2007 (21.6 percent).

ECONOMIC WELL-BEING

In 2007, 14 percent of North Dakota children lived in poverty, a rate unchanged in the last eight years.

- Income and poverty are issues that affect individual North Dakotans differently. As a whole, numbers for the state are encouraging. North Dakota families with children ages 0 to 17 earned a median income of \$44,640 in 2000. Current 2007 state-level data indicate that this median has risen to \$58,023 (to be 90 percent certain, this amount could be +/-\$1,690), a value similar to the national median of \$58,028 (+/-\$133) (U.S. Census Bureau, 2005-2007 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates, Table B19125, http://factfinder.census.gov).
- Even with the increase in median family income statewide from 2000 to 2007, child poverty numbers did not change during this time. In 2000, 14.0 percent of North Dakota children ages 0 to 17 lived in poverty (22,163 children). An additional 10.9 percent (17,225 children) were living near poverty levels (with incomes from 100 to 149 percent of poverty). In 14 of North Dakota's 53 counties, at least one in five children was impoverished. Current 2007 data suggest that, overall, there has been no change in North Dakota's child poverty rate since 2000, with 14.0 percent of children still living in poverty.
- While there were fewer counties with child poverty rates higher than 20.0 percent in 2007 than in 2000, only four counties had child poverty rates less than 10.0 percent in 2007. Child poverty rates were slightly smaller for older children in North Dakota. In 2007, 11.7 percent of North Dakota children ages 5 to 17 lived in poverty compared to 18.1 percent of children ages 0 to 4.
- Financial assistance programs are available to help low-income families and children in North Dakota. The Food Stamp Program (now referred to as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or SNAP) provided help to 31,380 children ages 0 to 18 in 2007 (20.6 percent of children statewide). In addition, 32,445 North Dakota children received free or reduced price lunches in school (32.1 percent of total school enrollment). In 12 of North Dakota's 53 counties, at least 40 percent of students received free or reduced price lunches in 2008.
- The Temporary Assistance to Needy Families Program (TANF), provided assistance to 7,532 North Dakota children ages 0 to 19 in 2008, down 8.9 percent per year, on average, since 2004. In addition, North Dakota helped low-income families pay childcare bills for 8,300 children ages 0 to 13 in 2007, or 7.7 percent of all children ages 0 to 13 statewide.



EDUCATION AND EARLY CARE

- North Dakota's public schools averaged 95,459 students daily during the 2007-08 academic year. As daily enrollments continue to decrease throughout the state (2.1 percent per year, on average, since 1996-97), expenditures continue to rise. Since 1996-97, per student expenditures have increased 7.0 percent per year on average, totaling \$8,096 per student in 2007-08.
- North Dakota students continue to rank relatively well nationally in terms of academic achievement; however, room exists for improvement. Composite scores for 2008 North Dakota public high school graduates taking the ACT averaged 21.5 out of a possible 36, slightly higher than the national average of 21.1. Beyond the overall composite ACT score, ACT, Inc. has developed benchmarks in the areas of English, math, reading, and science to measure what it takes to be successful in standard first-year college courses. Based on these benchmarks, 71.0 percent of the 2008 ACT-tested North Dakota high school graduates were ready for college English, 48.3 percent were ready for college reading, and 30.7 percent were ready for college science. However, 23.7 percent were ready for all four courses, a proportion that has changed little over the past several years.
- Despite less than half of high school graduates in North Dakota being ready for college math, only 14 percent of North Dakota 8th graders scored below the math proficiency level in 2007, the lowest rate in the nation (The Annie E. Casey Foundation, KIDS COUNT, http://datacenter.kidscount.org/).
- Various measures exist for determining high school dropout rates. According to the North Dakota Department of Public Instruction, the number of high school students (in grades 9 through 12) who were enrolled in school and then dropped out in 2008 totaled 791 (2.4 percent of high school enrollment). The national KIDS COUNT program publishes the proportion of teens ages 16 to 19 who are not in school and have not graduated. Using this measure, North Dakota has the lowest dropout rate in the nation (2 percent in 2007).
- In 2008, 13,278 North Dakota children ages 3 to 21 were enrolled in special education (14.0 percent of total public school enrollment). Statewide, 31.8 percent of students enrolled in special education had a specific learning disability, 27.4 percent had a speech impairment, 7.5 percent were emotionally disturbed, and 6.5 percent were mentally handicapped in 2008.

- North Dakota had the lowest high school dropout rate in the nation at 2% in 2007.

EDUCATION AND EARLY CARE (CONT.)

Legally recognized child-care providers in North Dakota numbered 3,432 in February 2009 and had the capacity to care for 43,193 children (approximately 55% of all children ages 0 to 13 with working parents).

- In North Dakota, it is estimated that 32,089 children ages 0 to 5 and 46,303 children ages 6 to 13 had working parents in 2007 (U.S. Census Bureau, 2005-2007 American Community Survey 3-Year PUMS, http://www.census.gov/acs/www/Products/PUMS/). Legally recognized child-care providers in North Dakota numbered 3,432 in February 2009 and had the combined capacity to care for 43,193 children. Legally recognized child-care providers include those who are licensed, self-certified, in-home providers, approved relatives, and registered tribal providers. Informal networks of relatives, friends, and neighbors, while difficult to track, also provide care for many North Dakota children.
- As of February 2009, North Dakota reported 1,663 licensed child-care programs. Licensed child care in North Dakota is state-approved and reviewed yearly, with licenses being granted by county social services. The majority of licensed child care in North Dakota takes place in a home setting. Family providers (25.1 percent) together with group child-care homes (50.6 percent) comprised 75.6 percent of all licensed providers in 2009. Large centers and group child-care facilities comprised 13.4 percent of licensed providers in the state. Other licensed providers consist of facilities holding multiple licenses, preschools, public approval programs, and school-age programs; together, they comprised 10.9 percent of all licensed providers in 2009.
- Legally recognized yet unlicensed child-care providers in the state included 902 self-certified and in-home providers, 164 registered tribal child-care providers, and 703 approved relatives in February 2009.
- Child care has become part of the daily routine for thousands of North Dakota families, many of whom are struggling. As mentioned in the Economic Well-Being component, the Child Care Assistance Program helped low-income families in North Dakota pay child-care bills for 8,300 children ages 0 to 13 in 2007, or 7.7 percent of all children ages 0 to 13 statewide.
- In addition to finding affordable child care, parents are also faced with finding a quality program they can trust and depend on.

 Quality child care is critical for providing safe and nurturing environments for children. To that end, the North Dakota Child Care Resource and Referral agency provides comprehensive training and consultation to improve the quality of programs caring for infants and toddlers (http://www.ndchildcare.org/).

HEALTH

- A healthy mother is vital to the health of her child. Prenatal care can improve birth outcomes and is more likely to be effective if begun early in pregnancy. Of the 8,818 North Dakota births in 2007, 478 (5.4 percent) were to mothers receiving late or no prenatal care. This rate is up from 4.7 percent in 2006.
- Throughout North Dakota, 557 babies were born weighing less than 5.5 pounds (or 2,500 grams) in 2007. These lowbirthweight babies comprised 6.3 percent of all births in 2007. Nationally, North Dakota had the 5th lowest percentage of lowbirthweight births among all states in 2006 (U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, CDC&P, National Center for Health Statistics, http://www.cdc.gov/nchs/vitalstats.htm).
- Of all North Dakota babies born in 2007, 65 died within a year (0.7 percent). In addition, 64 youth ages 1 to 19 died in 2007 (1.2 percent of all deaths).
- The supplemental nutrition program for women, infants and children (WIC) provides nutritious foods, nutrition counseling, and health and social service referrals to eligible participants at no charge. The number of North Dakota WIC program participants totaled 24,289 in 2008.
- To assist North Dakota children needing health care, 41,376 children ages 0 to 20 received health care assistance through Medicaid (23.2 percent of persons ages 0 to 20 statewide) in 2007. To help those children from working families that earn too much to qualify for full Medicaid coverage, but not enough to afford private insurance, the Healthy Steps program provided premium-free health coverage to 3,399 children in January 2009.
- While most children in North Dakota are covered by some form of health insurance, nearly 1 in 10 children (9.0 percent) in North Dakota are uninsured (13,000 children) (2005-2007 Three-Year Average from the U.S. Census Bureau, Current Population Survey, Annual Social and Economic Supplement, http://www.census.gov/hhes/www/hlthins/hlthins.html).
- The Small Area Health Insurance Estimates (SAHIE) program was created to develop estimates of health insurance coverage for counties and states. According to these estimates, 5.0 percent of North Dakota children ages 0 to 18 were uninsured and living below 200 percent of poverty in 2005 (7,620 children).

- According to Census estimates, 5.0% of North Dakota children ages 0 to 18 were uninsured and living below 200% of poverty in 2005.

SAFETY AND RISKY BEHAVIORS

North Dakota children requiring immediate services for abuse or neglect comprised 18.4% of all suspected child abuse and neglect victims in 2008. This proportion is down from 20.5% in 2007 and 23.9% in 2004.

- A total of 5,555 North Dakota juveniles ages 10 to 17 were referred to court a total of 10,394 times in 2008. Each time a juvenile is referred to court, he or she may be charged with multiple offenses. In 2008, North Dakota juveniles were charged with a total of 11,253 offenses. Thus, on average, each juvenile offender was charged with approximately two offenses in 2008 a rate that has remained relatively unchanged in North Dakota since 2003.
- While each juvenile court referral may have several charges for multiple offenses, an offense description is provided for the major offense only. The major offenses associated with the 10,394 North Dakota juvenile court referrals in 2008 were distributed into five categories: alcohol offenses (17.8 percent), unruly behavior (22.9 percent), offenses against person (7.8 percent), offenses against property (24.2 percent), and other offenses not included in the previously mentioned categories (e.g., disorderly conduct, controlled substance, traffic) (27.4 percent).
- North Dakota juveniles referred to court as a proportion of all youth ages 10 to 17 has remained relatively unchanged over the past several years. In 2008, 8.4 percent of all children ages 10 to 17 (5,555 juveniles) were referred to court for various offenses.
- In 2008, there were 6,982 children ages 0 to 17 suspected of being abused or neglected in North Dakota, or 4.9 percent of all children age 0 to 17. Following assessments of these cases by Child Protection Service social workers, it was determined that 1,283 children (18.4 percent of all suspected victims or 0.9 percent of all children ages 0 to 17) were in high-risk situations requiring immediate services. The proportion of abused and neglected children in North Dakota requiring immediate services in 2008 (18.4 percent) is down from 20.5 percent in 2007 and 23.9 percent in 2004.
- From 2007 to 2008, two in five North Dakota counties (21 out of 53) reported a decline in the proportion of abused and neglected children requiring immediate services.
- North Dakota children ages 16 to 19 who were not in school, not high school graduates, and not in the labor force (referred to as idle teens) comprised 1.7 percent of all children ages 16 to 19 in 2000. Only one state, Vermont, had a lower proportion (1.5 percent). Nationally, 3.9 percent of teens were considered idle. Current national and state-level 2007 data indicate that these proportions have changed little since 2000 (U.S. Census Bureau, 2005-2007 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates, Table B14005, http://factfinder.census.gov).


On-going evidence shows that challenges do not affect North Dakota children equally.



Facilities may include child-care institutions, residential treatment facilities, maternity homes, etc. Group Home Placements - an occupied private residence in which foster care is regularly provided for more than four but fewer than 10 unrelated children. Other Placements include runaways, supervised independent living, and cases for which no specific placement was identified. Special Education Enrollment in Public Schools, December 2008

Age categories provided for this indicator include Ages 3 to 5, Ages 6 to 11, Ages 12 to 17, and Ages 18 to 21. Emotionally Disturbed refers to a condition exhibiting one or more of the following characteristics over a long period of time and to a marked degree that adversely affects a child's educational performance: 1) inability to learn what cannot be explained by intellectual, sensory, or health factors; 2) inability to build or maintain satisfactory interpersonal relationships with peers and teachers; 3) inappropriate types of behavior or feelings under normal circumstances; 4) a general pervasive mood of unhappiness or depression; 5) a tendency to develop physical symptoms or fears associated with personal or school problems. The term also

includes schizophrenia. The term does not apply to children who are socially maladjusted unless it is determined they have a serious emotional disturbance. Speech or Language Impaired refers to a communication disorder such as stuttering, impaired articulation, language impairment, or a voice impairment that adversely affects a child's educational performance. Specific Learning Disability refers to a disorder in one or more of the basic psychological processes involved in understanding or in using language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself in an imperfect ability to listen, think, speak, read, write, spell, or do mathematical calculations. The term includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, brain injury, minimal brain dysfunction, dyslexia, and developmental aphasia. The term does not apply to children who have learning problems that are primarily the result of visual, hearing, or motor disabilities; mental handicap; emotional disturbance; or environmental, cultural, or economic disadvantage. Mentally Handicapped refers to significantly subaverage general intellectual functioning existing with additional deficits in motor, emotional, and social development. This category includes educable and trainable mentally handicapped individuals. PERCENTAGE: The percentage for the main indicator is the proportion that special education children represent of total public

Licensed Child-Care Providers, February 2009

Child-care providers who are licensed by the state and located on tribal lands are included in this category. A license is required if early childhood services are provided for four or more children ages 24

months and younger, or six or more children at any one time. A family child-care home provider refers to an occupied private residence in which early childhood services are provided for no more than seven children at any one time (or four infants). This type of home may also be allowed to care for up to two additional school-aged children during the two hours immediately before and after the school day or all day (except weekends or when school is not in session). A group child-care provider refers to an occupied private residence or other facility where early childhood services are provided for 8 to 18 children. A childcare center refers to an early childhood facility where early childhood services are provided to 19 or more children based on available space. A preschool educational facility refers to a facility offering early childhood services and following a preschool curriculum designed primarily to enhance the educational development of the children enrolled in the facility. Children are served for no more than three hours per day. A school-age program offers early childhood services to children before and after school and during school holidays and summer vacations. A public approval program refers to state agencies that have child-care facilities. A multiple license facility refers to a child-care facility with more than one type of license. Licensed Child-Care Capacity is the number of children that can be served by licensed child-care providers.

PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for the main indicator; the percentage for capacity is the proportion that licensed child-care capacity represents of the total child population ages 0 to 13 in respective geographic areas.

Child-care providers meeting these criteria and located on tribal lands are included in this category. Standard Compliance Certification (SCC) and In-Home Child-Care Capacity is the number of children that can be served by standard compliance and registered in-home childcare providers.

Approved Relative Child-Care Providers, February 2009

A sibling who is age 18 or older and who does not live in the same home as the child for whom care is being provided can also become an approved relative. Approved relative child-care providers located on tribal lands are included in this category. Approved Relative Child-Care Capacity is the number of children that can be served by approved relative child-care providers.

PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for the main indicator; the percentage for capacity is the proportion that approved relative child-care capacity represents of the total child population ages 0 to 13 in respective geographic areas. GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect the location of the child-care program. Out-of-state providers caring for North Dakota children are included in the state total.

Births to Mothers Receiving Inadequate Prenatal Care, Calendar Year 2007

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of resident live births calculated by using both an infant's gestational age at birth and the number of prenatal visits completed by the mother at the time of birth: 1) gestational age 14-21 weeks with no prenatal visits; 2) gestational age 22-29 weeks with one or fewer visits; 3) gestational age 30-31 weeks with two or fewer prenatal visits; 4) gestational age 32-33 weeks with three or fewer prenatal visits; 5) gestational age 34+ weeks with four or fewer prenatal visits. Women receiving adequate amounts of prenatal care include women who began their prenatal care in the first four months of pregnancy and, given the age of gestation at birth, made at least 80% of the recommended physician or clinic visits prior to delivery.

PERCENTAGE: The percentage is the proportion these infants represent of total resident live births in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect the mother's place of residence rather than the location of the hospital where the birth occurred.

DATE: Calendar Year 2007 (January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007). LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of births to mothers receiving inadequate prenatal care is five or less. In these cases, <6 is

GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect the mother's place of residence rather than the location of the hospital where the birth occurred.

DATE: Calendar Year 2007 (January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007). LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of low-weight births is five or less. In these cases, <6 is indicated.

Deaths of Infants Less Than 1 Year of Age, Calendar Year 2007

GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data are reported by the infant's place of residence rather than the location of death. DATE: Calendar Year 2007 (January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007). LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of infant deaths is five or less. In these cases, <6 is indicated.

NOTE: None.

Deaths of Children Ages 1 to 19, Calendar Year 2007

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of deaths for children ages 1 to 19, as recorded on death certificates.

PERCENTAGE: The percentage is the proportion these deaths represent of total deaths in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data are reported by the child's place of residence rather than the location of death.

DATE: Calendar Year 2007 (January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007).

LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of child deaths is five or less. In these cases, <6 is indicated.

NOTE: None.

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program Participants, Fiscal Year 2008

DEFINITION: This indicator represents persons who are eligible for and receive a food voucher and nutrition education contract through the WIC Program. The WIC Program provides coupons for specific foods to low-income pregnant and postpartum women, infants, and children younger than five years. To be eligible for WIC, low-income women, infants, and children must be found to be at nutritional risk for medical or dietary reasons. WIC is

a prevention program targeted to provide nutrition education, nutritious food, and access to health care. WIC is not an entitlement program.

PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for this indicator.

GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect place of residence.

DATE: Fiscal Year 2008 (July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008).

LIMITATIONS: Fort Berthold and Standing Rock Indian reservations administer their own programs. Thus, data for these two reservations are not included in the state WIC numbers. North Dakota WIC data do cover the Spirit Lake and Turtle Mountain reservations as well as the Trenton Indian Service Area.

NOTE: For confidentiality reasons, FY 2008 data for Slope County are included in the Bowman County number.

Uninsured Children Ages 0 to 18 Below 200% of Poverty, 2005

PERCENTAGE: The percentage is the proportion these children represent of the total child population ages 0 to 18 in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Geographical analysis is available by state and county. Data for planning regions are not available.

DATE: 2005.

LIMITATIONS: The estimates are based on statistical models and are subject to modeling error. For the 90% confidence intervals associated with state and county-level data, visit www.census.gov//did/www/sahie/.

NOTE: The estimates are based on statistical models using estimates of income and poverty from the Annual Social and Economic Supplement (a U.S. Census Bureau survey). The estimates are not direct counts from enumerations or administrative records, nor direct estimates from sample surveys.

Medicaid Recipients Ages 0 to 20, Fiscal Year 2007

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of persons ages 0 to 20 who are recipients of Medicaid. Medicaid is a federally funded entitlement program available to eligible persons based upon need. It is designed to assist individuals and families who do not have enough income to obtain health care. Medicaid is authorized by Title XIX, a 1965 amendment to the federal Social Security Act. Eligible persons include those receiving TANF or Social Security Income (SSI) payments; those terminated by TANF and in transition for 4 to 12 months; elderly, blind, or disabled people with low incomes; persons institutionalized, in foster homes, and certain adoptive children; pregnant women; and women with children ages 0 to 6. Medicaid differs from Medicare, which is a federally funded program for the elderly and disabled only.

PERCENTAGE: The percentage is the proportion these persons represent of the total population ages 0 to 20 in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect place of residence.

DATE: Fiscal Year 2008 (July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008).

LIMITATIONS: None.

NOTE: Data on Medicaid reported in *Fact Books* prior to the 2004 publication reflect persons receiving Medicaid but not TANF. Current reporting procedures by the North Dakota Department of Human Services required that the definition be changed to reflect all persons receiving Medicaid, regardless of whether or not they receive TANF.

Children Ages 0 to 18 Enrolled in Healthy Steps, January 2009

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of children under the age of 19 who are enrolled in the Healthy Steps program in North Dakota. Healthy Steps, North Dakota's health insurance plan for children, provides premium-free health coverage to uninsured children in qualifying families. It is intended to help meet the health care needs of children from working families that earn too much to qualify for

full Medicaid coverage, but not enough to afford private insurance.

PERCENTAGE: The percentage is the proportion these children represent of the total child population ages 0 to 18 in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect place of residence.

DATE: January 2009. LIMITATIONS: None.

NOTE: Coverage is available for uninsured children ages 18 and younger who live in families with qualifying incomes. Single 18-year-olds with eligible incomes may also apply. The income guidelines are established by the North Dakota Legislature. To qualify, a family's Net income (after subtracting child-care costs and payroll taxes such as social security tax, Medicare tax, and income tax) must be greater than the Medicaid level, but cannot exceed 150% of the federal poverty level. SAFETY AND RISKY BEHAVIORS

Child Abuse and Neglect Reports, Federal Fiscal Year 2008

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the total number of official assessments made to the North Dakota Department of Human Services (NDDHS) on behalf of a child where there is the suspicion of child abuse or neglect. Child abuse and neglect refers to any recent act or failure to act on the part of a parent or caregiver which results in death, serious physical or emotional harm, sexual abuse or exploitation, or an act or failure to act which presents an imminent risk of serious harm. Physical harm refers to any nonaccidental physical injury to the child, and can include striking, kicking, burning, or biting the child, or any action that results in a physical impairment of the child. Emotional harm refers to injury to the psychological capacity or emotional stability of the child as evidenced by an observable or substantial change in behavior, emotional response or cognition, or as evidenced by anxiety, depression, withdrawal, or aggressive behavior. A neglected child, also referred to

as a *deprived child*, refers to a child who: 1) is without proper parental care or control, subsistence, education, or other care or control necessary for the child's physical, mental, emotional health, or morals, and the deprivation is not due primarily to the lack of financial means of the child's parents, guardian, or other custodian; 2) has been placed for care or adoption in violation of law; 3) is without proper parental care, control, education, or other care and control necessary for the child's well-being because of the physical, mental, emotional, or other illness or disability of the child's parent or parents, and that such lack of care is not due to a willful act of commission or act of omission by the child's parents, and care is requested by a parent; 4) is in need of treatment and whose parents, guardian, or other custodian have refused to participate in treatment as ordered by the juvenile court; 5) was subject to prenatal exposure to chronic and severe use of alcohol or any controlled substance in a manner not lawfully prescribed by a practitioner; or 6) is present in an environment subjecting the child to exposure to a controlled substance or drug paraphernalia. Abandonment of a child refers to a situation in which: 1) the parent's identity or whereabouts are unknown, 2) the child has been left by the parent in circumstances where the child suffers serious harm, or 3) the parent has failed to maintain contact with the child or to provide reasonable support for a specified period of time. Definitions for sexual abuse are available in the North Dakota Century Code chapter 12.1-20 at http://www.legis.nd.gov/cencode/t121.html. The North Dakota Century Code mandates certain persons (those who have contact with children as a part of their professional duties) to report incidents of suspected child abuse or neglect. Any person may report an incident. The NDDHS or its designated agent, a regional or county Child Protection Service (CPS) social worker, will respond to the report by conducting an assessment of the family being reported. This process allows for the assessment of the present safety of the child(ren) and the risk of future maltreatment, while simultaneously noting family strengths and needs. These strengths, along with any necessary service interventions, may lead to the amelioration of child maltreatment within a particular family. The CPS social

workers use a risk assessment tool to help direct the intervention and assessment process. CPS teams determine if: 1) services are required, or 2) services are recommended, or 3) no services are required or recommended. Services are required if a high level of risk is determined to exist for the child(ren), and/or the family's needs are such that immediate service is required in order to lessen the safety risk. When it is determined that services are required, North Dakota Century Code requires a referral to Juvenile Court and a social worker (case manager) must be assigned to coordinate services. Services are recommended, but not required, if a low to intermediate risk level is determined to exist for the child(ren) and/or the family has service needs, but court action will not be requested at the time of the decision. If no services are required or recommended, it has been determined that: 1) no to low risk for the child(ren) exists; and/or 2) the CPS team suggests a discussion with the family on the availability of services, which are unrelated to any specific risk factors; and/or 3) the family's service need is nonexistent. PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for this indicator. GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect the location of the assessment. DATE: Federal Fiscal Year 2008 (October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2008). LIMITATIONS: Reports of child abuse and neglect from tribal areas are processed separately and are not included in these

Suspected Victims of Child Abuse and Neglect, Federal Fiscal Year 2008 DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of children involved in assessments made to the North Dakota

Department of Human Services (NDDHS) where there is the suspicion of child abuse or neglect (see the Child Abuse and Neglect Reports indicator definition for detailed definitions of abuse and neglect and a description of the assessment process). Child Protection Service (CPS) social workers determine if: 1) services are required, or 2) services are recommended, or 3) no services are required or recommended. When there are Victims in Cases Where Services Are Required, a high level of risk is determined to exist for the child(ren), and/or the family's needs are such that immediate service is required in order to lessen the safety risk. When it is determined that services are required, North Dakota Century Code requires a referral to Juvenile Court and a social worker (case manager) must be assigned to coordinate services (see the Child Abuse and Neglect Reports indicator definition for detailed definitions of other CPS determinations). PERCENTAGE: The percentage for the main indicator is the proportion that children who are suspected victims represent of the total child population ages 0 to 17 in respective geographic areas. The percentage for victims in cases where services are required is the proportion these children represent of total suspected child victims in respective geographic areas. GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect the location of the assessment. DATE: Federal Fiscal Year 2008 (October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2008). LIMITATIONS: Data exclude child abuse and neglect reports from tribal areas. NOTE: In an effort to coordinate with federal reporting procedures, data regarding child abuse and neglect are now presented for the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) (October-September) rather than for the Calendar Year (CY) (January-December). While trends are consistent between the two reporting procedures, please use caution when comparing FFY data (first reported in the 2007 Fact Book) with CY data which were reported prior to the 2007 Fact Book. Children Ages 10 to 17 Referred to Juvenile Court, Calendar Year 2008 DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of juveniles ages 10 to 17

year. It excludes children in cases involving abandonment, abuse/neglect, deprivation, file 960 (when no further action is recommended), educational neglect, other or no fault deprivation, termination of parental rights, or other special proceedings. PERCENTAGE: The percentage is the proportion these children represent of the total child population ages 10 to 17 in respective geographic areas. GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect the offense location, not the juvenile's place of residence. In addition, the number of juveniles is unduplicated only at the county level of geography. Approximately 5% of juvenile offenders were referred to court in multiple counties in 2008. In these cases, each juvenile is counted once for each county in which they are referred. However, because the regional and state level data are a sum of the counties, these multi-county offenders are duplicated at the regional and state levels of geography.

Juvenile Court Referrals by Major Offense, Calendar Year 2008

DEFINITION: This indicator represents all cases referred to juvenile court along with the description of the major offense associated with each referral. A juvenile referred to court may be charged with multiple offenses; however, only a description of the major offense for each referral is provided. The major offense

subcategories include Alcohol Offense. Unruly Behavior, Offense Against Person, Offense Against Property, and Other Offense. Offenses are incidents that require referral to Juvenile Court, and can be made by police, parents, school teachers/officials, or other sources. These referrals exclude cases involving abandonment, abuse/neglect, deprivation, file 960 (when no further action is recommended), educational neglect, other or no fault deprivations, termination of parental rights, or other special proceedings. Alcohol Offense includes the purchase or possession of alcohol by a minor, delivery of alcohol to a minor, minor in a liquor establishment, and minor in possession/consumption. Unruly Behavior includes runaways in- and out-of-state, truancy, ungovernable behavior, violation of conditions for conduct and control, violation of curfew, and other unruly behavior. Offense Against Person includes assault, homicide, kidnapping or unlawful restraint, sex offenses, and other offenses against a person. Offense Against Property includes arson or endangering by fire, burglary, criminal mischief or damaging property, criminal trespass, forgery and counterfeiting, robbery, shoplifting, theft (other than shoplifting), unauthorized use of vehicle, and other offenses against property. Other Offense includes disorderly conduct, possession or purchase of controlled substances, cruelty to animals, tobacco purchase/smoking, resisting arrest, driving under the influence, driving without a license, open container, carrying a concealed weapon, illegal possession of a firearm, and all other offenses not contained in the above categories.

PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for the main indicator. The percentages for the major offense subcategories represent the proportion that each major offense category represents of total juvenile court referrals in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect the offense location, not the juvenile's place of residence.

DATE: Calendar Year 2008 (January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008). LIMITATIONS: Referrals made to the four tribal courts in North Dakota are not included in this indicator.

NOTE: A new reporting procedure for juvenile court referrals was implemented by

the North Dakota Supreme Court beginning with 2003 data. In this new reporting procedure, the data reflect the year in which the case was referred to court, not the year when the case was settled (disposition date). This new reporting procedure affects data that were first reported by North Dakota KIDS COUNT in the 2005 Fact Book. Fact Books prior to the 2006 publication, subcategories were incorrectly reported under the "Juvenile Offenses" indicator. Prior to the 2006 publication, when a referral had multiple charges, the major offense description for the referral was inappropriately applied to each of the individual charges associated with that referral, which provided an inaccurate representation of the various offenses being committed, and overrepresenting the main offense. Juvenile offenses exclude referral cases involving abandonment, abuse/neglect, deprivation, file 960 (when no further action is recommended), educational neglect, other or no fault deprivations, termination of parental rights, or other special proceedings. PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for this indicator. GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data reflect the offense location, not the juvenile's place of residence. DATE: Calendar Year 2008 (January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008). LIMITATIONS: Offenses from referrals made to the four tribal courts in North Dakota are not included in this indicator. NOTE: A new reporting procedure for juvenile court referrals was implemented by the North Dakota Supreme Court beginning with 2003 data. In this new reporting procedure, the data reflect the year in which the case was referred to court, not the year when the case was settled (disposition

date). This new reporting procedure affects data that were first reported by North Dakota KIDS COUNT in the 2005 Fact Book. Thus, caution should be used when making comparisons to data presented in Fact Books prior to the 2005 publication. The various types of offenses are no longer presented as subcategories of the Juvenile Offenses indicator, as they were in Fact Book publications prior to 2006. Rather, a description of the major offense for each referral is now reported under the Juvenile Court Referrals by Major Offense indicator (a new indicator for the 2006 Fact Book). Children Ages 16 to 19 Not Enrolled in High School, Not High School Graduates, and Not in the Labor Force, 2000

PERCENTAGE: The percentage is the proportion these children represent of the total child population ages 16 to 19 in respective geographic areas. GEOGRAPHY: County and regional data

reflect the child's place of residence.

DATE: April 1, 2000. LIMITATIONS: None.
