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PREFACE

WHAT IS KIDS COUNT?

KIDS COUNT, a project of the Annie E. Casey Foundation, is a national and state-level effort to track the well-being of children in the United States. At the national level, the project develops and distributes reports on key areas of well-being, including the annual KIDS COUNT Data Book, and explores the well-being of children using current data and policy analysis. The Foundation also maintains the KIDS COUNT Data Center, which uses the best available data to measure the educational, social, economic, and physical well-being of children. The Data Center features hundreds of indicators with more than four million data points. Users of the site are able to view national, congressional district, county, school district, and city data from across the country (https://datacenter.kidscount. org). In addition, the Annie E. Casey Foundation funds a network of statelevel organizations in all 50 states, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and the District of Columbia that provides a community-level picture of the condition of children. Both national and state KIDS COUNT programs strive to document conditions affecting children in the areas where they live so that national, state, and local decision-making can address children's needs more effectively through appropriate policies and programs. The program has been examining critical issues for North Dakota children and families since 1994. The mission of North Dakota KIDS COUNT is to provide objective, reliable, and relevant information on child well-being in order to inform local and state discussions about how to secure a better future for all children in North Dakota. North Dakota KIDS COUNT provides county, state planning region, and reservation-specific data on the KIDS COUNT Data Center and provides an annual compendium of child well-being indicators, a quarterly fact sheet, a newsletter, a website, and a Facebook page. WHAT IS THE NORTH DAKOTA KIDS COUNT FACT BOOK?

The North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book, now in its 25th year, is an annual publication that provides regional and county-level profiles consisting of multiple indicators nested within six components of child well-being (i.e., demographics, family and community, economic well-being, education and early care, health, and safety and risky behavior).

Actual numbers of children or events are presented along with percentages to allow county-to-county and region-to-region comparisons. Data presented in the state profile are repeated in each county and regional profile for easy comparison.

Definitions and Data Sources

This section supplies explanations and indicator definitions along with limitations and information sources for respective data. Readers are strongly encouraged to use these definitions for clarification and reference for the data provided.

METHODOLOGY

MODIFICATIONS

This year's release of the *North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book*, presents two new indicators. In addition to these arrivals, there have been modifications and developments described below.

1. New Indicators

Children Enrolled in Healthy Steps. New to the 2019 Fact Book is the number of children enrolled in Healthy Steps, the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in North Dakota. Healthy Steps is intended to help those children in working families that earn too much to qualify for Medicaid but not enough for private insurance.

Young Adults with Some College or a College Degree. Also new to this year's *Fact Book* is the number of young adults ages 18 through 24 who have completed some college or have attained a college degree (i.e., Associate's, Bachelor's, Graduate, or Professional degree).

2. Modifications

Children Enrolled in Special Education. Data for this indicator are obtained from the North Dakota Department of Public Instruction (ND DPI). Due to new suppression standards from ND DPI, all events fewer than 10 are not reported. To uphold these new standards and maintain confidentiality, enrollment numbers by age and type of disability will no longer be reported at the county level of geography in the *Fact Book*. However, aggregates by age and type of disability are still made available for North Dakota overall and for the eight planning regions.

3. New Developments

Reservation Profiles. As a supplement to this year's *Fact Book*, child well-being profiles will be available for reservation areas on our website. Profiles for the Fort Berthold, Spirit Lake, Standing Rock, and Turtle Mountain reservations are presented in PDF format at https://www.ndkidscount.org/publications.php.

Please note that while similar indicators are presented in the reservation profiles as in the *Fact Book*, in some cases the data sources may differ. Thus, statewide comparison values may differ from those presented on the following pages.

LIMITATIONS

General

Overall, indicators have been chosen on the basis of their availability by county, their ability to convey broad elements of child well-being, the extent to which they provide for common interpretation, their availability over time, their usefulness as a tool to track long-term trends in child well-being, and the validity of data sources.

In some cases, the data are likely conservative estimates as not all children affected by a particular condition are reported to or identified by the proper authorities, nor are they all enrolled in an appropriate service program. Therefore, caution must be exercised in concluding that these data represent the actual number of children whose lives may be affected by a given situation.

North Dakota KIDS COUNT gathers and organizes, but does not generate, the statistical information contained in the *Fact Book*. Please refer to the Definitions and Data Sources section for limitations and notes specific to each indicator.

American Indian Children

The 2019 North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book data include American Indian children living outside American Indian tribal areas in all indicators. American Indian children living within tribal areas are included in all indicators with the following exceptions: data for Child Abuse and Neglect Reports and Victims exclude tribal data; WIC data exclude the Fort Berthold Reservation and the Standing Rock Reservation; and Youth Referred to Juvenile Court exclude tribal court referrals (see map on page 19 for tribal areas in North Dakota).

DEMOGRAPHICS

While racial and ethnic minority children continue to represent a relatively small percentage of ND's youth, the state is continuing to become more racially and ethnically diverse.

SUMMARY AND FINDINGS

Population

Following seven years of continuous, rapid growth from 2008 to 2015, North Dakota's population began to stabilize. Increasing an average of 2.1 percent annually, the state's population grew from 641,421 in 2008 to 754,022 in 2015. There was relatively no change in the state's population in 2016 and 2017. Current 2018 numbers show a 1 percent increase to 760,077 people in North Dakota¹.

North Dakota's population growth was partly due to an increase in the number of births. Total births began to increase in 2002 when there were 7,755 babies born in North Dakota. By 2014, there were 11,352 births recorded statewide. Following this rapid increase, there was relatively little change in the number of births in 2015 and 2016. In 2017, births decreased by 6 percent to 10,738. This decade-long trend in births along with an in-migration of families has resulted in a growing child population in North Dakota. Similar to the overall population change in the state, the total child population ages 0 through 17 grew an average of 2.3 percent per year from 2008 to 2017, reaching 175,772 children.

During the period of rapid population growth from 2008 through 2015, the majority of counties in the state (all but eight) had an increase in child population, with the fastest growth located in the far western portion of the state (i.e., Regions 1 and 8). Current estimates suggest the growth has moderated, with 31 counties losing child population in 2017.

Teen Births

In contrast to the growing number of total births in the state, the number of teen births is decreasing. In 1982, the 1,264 teen births comprised 10 percent of all resident births in North Dakota. In 2017, there were 370 teen births representing about 3 percent of all births statewide. Since 2008, the teen birth rate has dropped an average of 6 percent per year for American Indian, white, and Hispanic teens; 5 percent per year for black teens. Despite these improvements, the teen birth rate is 3 to 6 times higher for racial and ethnic minority teens than for white teens in North Dakota².

Race and Ethnicity

Race and ethnicity have important implications for culture, identity, and overall well-being. Children of different races and ethnicities often show large variation in well-being including health, mortality, school performance, and access to family and community resources³.

While racial and ethnic minority children continue to represent a relatively small percentage of North Dakota's youth, the state is continuing to become more diverse. Comprising 17 percent of North Dakota's children in 2017, the number of black, Asian, and American Indian children combined grew four times faster than white children from 2010 to 2017. The number of Hispanic youth (6% of all children in North Dakota) grew nine times faster than the number of non-Hispanic children. Despite the increase in racial and ethnic diversity among North Dakota's child population, the state is less diverse than most states, ranking 44th out of 50 states in 2017 (in the percent of non-white and Hispanic youth).

Family and Community

SUMMARY AND FINDINGS

Living Arrangements

The majority of all North Dakota children ages 0 through 17 live with their parents, and most children live with both parents. When compared with other states, North Dakota had the third largest percentage of children living with both parents in 2017 (69%). Despite this ranking, the composition of families in North Dakota, and throughout the nation, is changing. While 69 percent of North Dakota children live with both parents, this percentage is down from 82 percent in 1990. During the same period of time, the percentage of children living with a single parent has increased. In 1990, 14 percent of children lived with a single parent. This percentage increased to 23 percent in 2017. Also on the rise is the number of children living with a grandparent. In 2017, 4 percent of children lived with a grandparent (7,443 children), which is up from 2 percent in 1990 (2.628 children).

About 2 percent of North Dakota children received foster care services in 2018 (2,738 children). The majority of children in foster care are in a family home (86% in 2018), which is up from 76% in 2010. Nationally, 86% of foster children were placed in families in 2017¹. Parental drug abuse is the leading reason for a child's placement in North Dakota foster care (36% of cases in 2018).

While most North Dakota babies are born to married mothers, nearly one-third of births in 2017 were to unmarried women (31%). Births to unmarried women comprised 23 percent of all births in 1994 and grew an average of 3 percent annually through 2005 where it has remained relatively unchanged through 2017. About 10 percent of births to unmarried women were to teenagers. Births to unmarried teens ages 12 through 19 totaled 339 in 2017, which is 3 percent of all births statewide.

Working Parents

Taking care of young children while holding down a job can be challenging. Yet, a major contributor to financial stability and well-being of children is secure parental employment². In 2017, 80 percent of North Dakota mothers were in the labor force, the seventh largest percentage among states; nationally, 73 percent of mothers were in the labor force. In addition, 75 percent of children ages 0 through 13 in North Dakota lived in situations where all parents residing in the household were in the labor force - the eight largest percentage among states in 2017. Nationally, 68 percent of children lived in households where all parents were in the labor force.

Employed Youth

Employment can provide valuable experience for youth. In moderation, work experience can help youth build skills and can open up valuable opportunities as youth prepare for work and a career³. In North Dakota, nearly half of teens ages 16 through 19 were employed in 2017 (46%), which is the second largest percentage among states (behind South Dakota). Among young adults ages 20 through 24 in North Dakota, 76 percent were employed in 2017 - which is the second largest percentage among states (behind Minnesota).

North Dakota had the second largest percentage of employed teens in the nation (46%) as well as the second largest percentage of employed young adults ages 20-24 (76%) in 2017.

ECONOMIC WELL-BEING

Many families face significant barriers to financial stability. In North Dakota, nearly 1 in 3 children lived in low-income families (those earning less than twice the poverty threshold) in 2017.

SUMMARY AND FINDINGS

Income and Poverty

A family's economic situation has important implications for the health and well-being of a child. Financially stable families have resources to cover their expenses and save for the future. This stability helps provide their children with a foundation for future success. In North Dakota, the median household income for families with children grew to \$79,077 in 2017, up 10 percent from 2010 after adjusting for inflation. In addition, the child poverty rate in North Dakota was 12 percent in 2017, which is down from 15 percent in 2012.

Despite continued improvement in the child poverty rate, significant disparities exist in North Dakota with respect to age, race and ethnicity, family type, and place. Younger children are more likely than older children to live in families struggling to cover basic expenses for housing, food, transportation, health care, and child care (15% and 12%, respectively). Hispanic and racial minority youth are 2 to 6 times more likely than white children to live in poverty. Children living with a single parent are eight times more likely to live in poverty than children living with married parents (34% and 4%, respectively). Children living on reservations tend to have the highest child poverty rates in North Dakota. Currently, about half of all children in Rolette, Sioux, and Benson counties live in families with incomes below the poverty line.

In 2017, the official income amount considered sufficient for a family of four (2 adults, 2 children) to afford basic necessities was \$24,858 (i.e., poverty threshold)¹. However, research shows that families need an income of at least twice the threshold to cover basic living expenses². In North Dakota, 30 percent of children lived in families earning less than twice the poverty threshold in 2017 (i.e., low income families).

Public Assistance

Many families face significant barriers to financial stability. For some children, growing up in an impoverished family can create cumulative disadvantages that can powerfully influence the direction of a child's life, especially if those disadvantages are not mitigated by other sources of support. Efforts to assist families that are struggling include various public programs such as the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) which helped provide food to 36,141 North Dakota children ages 0 through 18 in 2018 (20% of children statewide). In North Dakota public schools, 37,533 children were eligible for free or reduced price lunches in 2018 (31% of total school enrollment). In five of North Dakota's 53 counties, at least half of students were eligible for free or reduced price lunches in 2018 (Rolette, Sioux, Benson, Grant, and Mountrail).

The Temporary Assistance to Needy Families Program (TANF), designed to help families in need achieve self-sufficiency, provided assistance to 4,425 North Dakota children ages 0 through 19 in 2018, which is down an average of 7 percent per year since 2010. In an effort to allow parents to work or attain the education necessary to become employed and self-sufficient, 4,982 children benefited from the North Dakota Child Care Assistance program in 2018 (4% of all children 0 through 13 statewide).

EDUCATION AND EARLY CARE

SUMMARY AND FINDINGS

Enrollment

Mirroring the growth in the state's child population, North Dakota school enrollment continues to grow. As the result of a growing number of births and net in-migration to North Dakota, school enrollment began to increase beginning in 2009-10, averaging about 2 percent annually through 2017-18. Daily enrollment in North Dakota public schools averaged 112,269 in 2017-18, a 3 percent increase from the previous year. Despite this growth, overall expenditures, which averaged \$11,604 per student in 2017-18, decreased by 1 percent from 2016-17.

Effective and appropriate education is an important resource for improving long-term outcomes for children and youth with special needs. In 2018, there were 15,881 North Dakota children enrolled in special education (14% of total enrollment). Of children enrolled in special education, 29 percent had a specific learning disability, 19 percent had a speech impairment, 9 percent were identified with an Autism Spectrum Disorder, 8 percent were emotionally disturbed, and 5 percent had an intellectual disability - a distribution unchanged from the previous year.

According to decades of research, the best way to ensure successful students and productive adults is to invest in early childhood development¹. In North Dakota, 33 percent of children ages 3 and 4 were enrolled in early education programs in 2017 (i.e., programs offering educational experiences preceding kindergarten, including Head Start) - which is down from 37 percent in 2012 and currently the smallest percentage among states.

Achievement

Most teenagers in North Dakota are engaged in school or work (95% in 2017)² and most high school students graduate on time (88% in 2018). Of those students who graduate, many go on for higher levels of education. In Fall 2016, approximately three-fourths of recent North Dakota high school graduates were enrolled in college (4,877 students)³. Of all young adults ages 18 to 24, 64 percent had some college or a college degree in 2017 - second only to the District of Columbia.

In preparation for college, nearly all North Dakota high school students take the ACT which is a national college admissions examination. ACT, Inc. has developed benchmarks in the areas of English, math, reading, and science to measure what it takes to be successful in standard first-year college courses. Based on these four benchmark areas, 57 percent of the 2018 ACT-tested North Dakota high school graduates were ready for college English, 39 percent were ready for college math, 43 percent were ready for college reading, and 34 percent were ready for college science. Approximately one in five graduates (23%) was ready for all four courses.

When disaggregated by race and ethnicity, data show that minority youth face significant obstacles to college readiness. However, overall ACT composite scores showed improvement in 2018 for American Indian and African American high school students in North Dakota⁴.

Among young adults ages 18-24 in North Dakota, 64% had some college or a college degree in 2017 - the second highest percentage among states.

About 75% of children ages 0-13 live in families where all parents are working - which was the 8th largest percentage among states in 2017.

SUMMARY AND FINDINGS

Child Care

North Dakota has the highest proportion of working adults in the nation (80% in 2017)¹ and the fourth lowest unemployment rate among states (2.6% in 2018)². This means that for working parents, the need for quality early care and educational opportunities is significant. In fact, 75 percent of children ages 0 through 13 live in families where all the parents are in the labor force (i.e., 97,905 children statewide) - which was the eighth largest percentage among states in 2017. In four of North Dakota's 53 counties, more than 90 percent of children ages 0 through 13 live in families where all the parents are in the labor force (Golden Valley, Ramsey, Bowman, and Griggs).

With most parents working, reliable and affordable child care can help provide parents with greater opportunity to be productive at work and school. In addition, high-quality child care nurtures, stimulates, and supports children as they build the confidence and critical capacities they need to thrive in school and in life³.

As of February 2019, there were 1,577 licensed child care providers in North Dakota with the capacity to care for 43,405 children. This means that licensed child care programs in the state have the ability to meet approximately 44 percent of potential need (children ages 0 through 13 living in families with all parents in the labor force). According to Child Care Aware of North Dakota, national child care standards recommend that licensed care should meet at least 50 percent of potential need⁴. Currently, 13 counties in North Dakota meet this recommended minimum, which is an increase from five counties in February 2018.

Unlicensed Child Care

Legally recognized yet unlicensed child care providers in the state included 129 self-certified and in-home providers, 22 registered tribal child care providers, and 157 approved relatives in February 2019. Combined, these providers had the capacity to care for 1,119 children.

Informal networks of relatives, friends, and neighbors provide care for many North Dakota children. These cases are difficult to track and the number of providers and quality of care are not monitored. Yet these providers play an important role in helping prepare North Dakota children for school and future success.

Child Care Costs and Assistance

Child care has become part of the daily routine for thousands of North Dakota families, many of whom are struggling financially. According to 2018 data from Child Care Aware of North Dakota, care for one infant in a licensed center averages \$9,060 annually - and can reach up to \$16,640⁵.

As mentioned in the Economic Well-Being component of this report, the Child Care Assistance Program helped low-income families in North Dakota pay child care bills for 4,982 children in 2018, or 4 percent of all children ages 0 through 13 statewide.

SUMMARY AND FINDINGS

Vital Records

A healthy mother is important to the health of a child. Prenatal care can improve birth outcomes and is more likely to be effective if begun early in pregnancy¹. Of the 10,738 North Dakota births in 2017, 13 percent were to mothers receiving no prenatal care or to mothers beginning care after the first trimester, which is an improvement from 16 percent in 2010. Mothers who do not receive prenatal care are much more likely to give birth to a low birth weight baby¹. In 2017, 724 babies were born with a low birth weight (i.e., less than 5.8 pounds or 2,500 grams), which is 7 percent of all births. North Dakota had the fourth lowest percentage of low birth weight babies in the nation in 2017².

The death of a child is a tragedy for family and friends, and a loss to the community. For every 1,000 babies born in 2017, about four died within the year — an improvement from 7 per 1,000 in 2010. Of all deaths in 2017, 49 were children and youth ages 1 through 19. The majority of these deaths was due to injury (47% were accidents and 25% were suicides)³.

Hearing Impairment

Hearing loss can affect a child's ability to develop communication, language, and social skills. The earlier that children with a hearing impairment receive services, the more likely they are to reach their full potential. In 2017, nearly all resident live births in North Dakota were screened for hearing loss (99%); of those screened, 10 percent did not pass the initial screening and were referred for further testing.

Assistance

The supplemental nutrition program for women, infants, and children (WIC) provides nutritious foods, nutrition counseling, and health and social service referrals to eligible participants at no charge. The number of North Dakota WIC participants totaled 19,496 in 2018. The number of WIC participants decreased an average of 3 percent annually since 2008.

To assist North Dakota children needing health care, 57,213 youth (27% of youth 0 through 20) received health care assistance through Medicaid in 2018, which is down 5 percent from 59,899 in 2017. To help those children in working families that earn too much to qualify for Medicaid but not enough for private insurance, the Healthy Steps program provided coverage to 2,870 children in 2018 (2% of children ages 0 through 18).

Uninsured Children

Children without health insurance have limited access to health care, which can lead to a greater risk of illness and hospitalization. A lack of health insurance can have a negative influence on school attendance and participation in extracurricular activities, and increased financial and emotional stress among parents⁴. While most children in North Dakota have some form of health insurance, 13,590 lack coverage. Relative to other states, North Dakota has the seventh highest uninsured rate for children at 8 percent in 2017. About 44 percent of uninsured children live in families with low incomes and are potentially eligible for programs such as Medicaid and Healthy Steps.

SUMMARY AND FINDINGS

Juvenile Court Referrals

Juvenile delinquency has potentially high stakes for both individuals and society as a whole. Delinquency is linked to higher crime rates in adulthood and other negative outcomes. In many states, up to 80 percent of youth who are incarcerated are arrested within three years of release¹. A total of 3,248 North Dakota youth were referred to court (at least once) for delinquent or unruly behavior in 2018 (5% of all youth ages 10 through 17). Similar to a national downward trend, the number of North Dakota juveniles referred to court decreased an average of 5 percent annually from 2010 to 2018.

In 2018, the five most common delinquent referrals received by the Juvenile Courts were simple assault (14%), theft of property and shoplifting (11%), disorderly conduct (11%), possession of a controlled substance (9%), and possession of drug paraphernalia (8%)².

Of the unruly referrals received in 2018 (offenses which only a child can commit), 25 percent were for youth who had runaway, 23 percent were for unlawful possession/consumption of alcohol, 27 percent were for ungovernable behavior, 14 percent were for school truancy, and 11 percent were for such things as tobacco and curfew violations².

Child Abuse and Neglect

Providing children with safe and secure environments free from abuse and neglect will improve the likelihood of positive educational, emotional, and social outcomes that extend into adulthood. Yet, in 2018 there were 7,297 children suspected of being abused or neglected in North Dakota. When a suspected case of abuse or neglect is investigated by the North Dakota Child Protection Services Program, a determination is made as to whether services are required to provide for the protection and treatment of a child.

Following assessments of the 2018 cases by social workers in North Dakota, it was determined that 2,097 children were in high-risk situations requiring immediate services. The number of children requiring services for abuse and neglect has increased an average of 8 percent each year since 2010. Overall, for every 1,000 children in North Dakota, approximately 11.9 were maltreated in 2018; nationally, the rate was 9.1 per 1,000 in 2017³.


Idle Teens

The transition from youth into independent adulthood involves many challenges. While there are multiple pathways to success, the consequences of unemployment, under-employment, or not acquiring post-secondary education can be damaging and enduring. Males who are neither enrolled in school nor working are more likely to engage in delinquent behavior or illegal activities. Females in this group are more likely to become dependent on welfare⁴. Similar to the national average, North Dakota youth who were not in school, not high school graduates, and not in the labor force (i.e., idle) comprised 2 percent of all teens in 2017 (847 teens).

State, Regional, and County Profiles







Eligible Recipients of Free or Reduced Price Lunch

Child Care Assistance Recipients Ages 0-13

The purpose of the Child Care Assistance Program is to help low-income families with child care costs while they are working or participating in allowable training or allowable education programs. For eligible families, the North Dakota Department of Human Services pays a percentage of their child care bill determined by using a sliding fee scale. Average Expenditures Per Student in Public Schools

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the average per student expenditures (in dollars) for instruction, administration, operation, and maintenance for public schools in respective geographic areas during a given school year.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the public school, not the student's place of residence.

TIME FRAME: Academic Year (Fall

through Spring).

SOURCE: North Dakota Department of Public Instruction.

Average Daily Membership of Public Schools

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the average number of students enrolled per day in public schools for respective geographic areas during a given school year.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the public school, not the student's place of residence.

TIME FRAME: Academic Year (Fall through Spring).

SOURCE: North Dakota Department of Public Instruction.

Special Education Enrollment in Public Schools

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of public school children ages 3 through 21 enrolled in special education by age categories and in the following selected special education subcategories: Autism Spectrum Disorder, Emotionally Disturbed, Intellectual Disability, Non-Categorical Delay, Speech or Language Impaired, Specific Learning Disability, and Other Disability or Impairment. Age categories provided for this indicator include Ages 3-5, Ages 6-11, Ages 12-17, and Ages 18-21.

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), often used synonymously with Autism, is a developmental disability significantly affecting verbal and nonverbal communication and social interaction. generally evident before age three that adversely affects a child's educational performance. The term autism does not apply if the child's educational performance is adversely affected primarily because the child has an emotional disturbance, as defined by Emotionally Disturbed category. ASD includes a spectrum of characteristics and levels of severity seen in individuals with the disorder and includes autistic disorders, Asperger's disorder, childhood disintegrative disorder, Rett's disorder, and pervasive developmental disorder. Emotionally Disturbed refers to a condition exhibiting one or more of the following characteristics over a long period of time and to a marked degree that adversely affects a child's educational performance: 1) inability to learn what cannot be explained

by intellectual, sensory, or health factors; 2) inability to build or maintain satisfactory interpersonal relationships with peers and teachers; 3) inappropriate types of behavior or feelings under normal circumstances; 4) a general pervasive mood of unhappiness or depression; 5) a tendency to develop physical symptoms or fears associated with personal or school problems. The term also includes schizophrenia. The term does not apply to children who are socially maladjusted unless it is determined they have a serious emotional disturbance. Intellectual Disability refers to significantly sub-average general intellectual functioning, existing concurrently with deficits in adaptive behavior and manifested during the developmental period, that adversely affects a child's educational performance. Non-Categorical Delay refers to a category of disability used as a last resort, i.e., when the child's assessed characteristics do not fit the eligibility requirements of any of the existing disability categories. Eligibility is based on developmental delay or inconsistencies in demonstrating developmental milestones. Developmental delay is defined as demonstrating a developmental profile that documents skill acquisition that is significantly below that of chronologically same-age peers in one or more of the following areas: cognitive; fine motor; gross motor; vision; hearing; communication, which may include speech and language; pre-academic; socialization, which may include interactional and emotional development; and adaptive skills which may include self-help, attending, behavior control, and creative play; exhibited by a child ages 3 through 9 who is determined by a multi-disciplinary assessment team to be in need of special education.

Speech or Language Impaired refers to a communication disorder such as stuttering, impaired articulation, language impairment, or a voice impairment that adversely affects a child's educational performance.

Specific Learning Disability refers to a disorder in one or more of the basic psychological processes involved in understanding or using language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself in an imperfect ability to listen, think, speak, read, write, spell, or do mathematical calculations. The term includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities,

brain injury, minimal brain dysfunction, dyslexia, and developmental aphasia. The term does not apply to children who have learning problems that are primarily the result of visual, hearing, or motor disabilities; intellectual disability; emotional disturbance; or environmental, cultural, or economic disadvantage.

Other Disability or Impairment includes individuals experiencing deafness and blindness, a hearing impairment, an orthopedic impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment, and other health impairments.

PERCENTAGE: The denominator for the main indicator is total public school enrollment in respective geographic areas. The denominator for the subcategories (by each age group and type) is the total child population enrolled in special education in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the school location, not the student's place of residence. TIME FRAME: December of referenced year.

NOTE: Amendments to federal law removed the word "Seriously" from the subcategory Emotionally Disturbed. This name change was first reflected in the 2001 Fact Book. The definition of this special education subcategory was not affected. Beginning with the 2012 Fact Book, the subcategory Mentally Handicapped was changed, based on 2011 state legislation, to Intellectual Disability. The definition of this special education subcategory was not affected. LIMITATIONS: To uphold suppression standards and maintain confidentiality, enrollment numbers by age and type of disability are not reported at the county level of geography. However, aggregates by age and type of disability are made available for North Dakota overall and for the eight planning regions.

Children Ages 3 and 4 Enrolled in Early Education

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of children ages 3 and 4 enrolled in early education. Early education includes any group providing educational experiences for children during the years preceding kindergarten. Places where instruction is an integral part of the program are included, but private homes that primarily provide

custodial care are not included. Children enrolled in programs sponsored by federal, state or local agencies to provide preschool education to young children, including Head Start programs, are considered as enrolled in early education. Children enrolled in kindergarten are excluded from this analysis. PERCENTAGE: The denominator is the total number of children ages 3 and 4 in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect place of residence.

TIME FRAME: Data represent a 5-year period estimate. For example, 2017 estimates reflect data collected over a 60-month period from 2013 through 2017. LIMITATIONS: Data are based on a sample and are subject to sampling variability. Margins of error corresponding to a 90% confidence interval can be found at https://bit.ly/2m9jMKY. Characteristics for geographic areas experiencing dynamic change due to such things as an environmental catastrophe (e.g., flood) or a plant closing will be mitigated since these estimates cover five calendar years of data. Also, caution is needed when using the multi-year estimates for estimating year-toyear change in a particular characteristic. This is because four of the five years in the 5-year estimate overlap with the next year's estimate. Ideally, trend analysis with multi-year estimates should be done using estimates from non-overlapping periods (e.g., 2008-2012 and 2013-2017). Four-Year High School Cohort Graduation Rate

DEFINITION: This indicator represents students in a cohort who graduate high school with a standard diploma in four years, as a percent of the entire graduating class cohort. Adjustments are made for transfers into and out of the school, district, or state.

PERCENTAGE: The denominator for the percentage is the cohort for that graduating class in respective geographic areas. A cohort includes the number of first-time 9th graders in the fall of a particular school year plus students who transfer in, minus students who transfer out, emigrate, or die during the next four school years. The percentage is referred to as the cohort graduation rate.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the school location, not the student's place of residence. TIME FRAME: Academic Year (Fall through Spring).

Average ACT Composite Score

DEFINITION: This indicator represents average American College Testing (ACT) Program scores of graduating public high school seniors in respective geographic areas. TIME FRAME: Reference year of high school graduating class.

NOTE: A law passed by the 2009 North Dakota Legislative Assembly requires high school students to take the ACT or the WorkKeys assessment (i.e., a job skills assessment system measuring "real-world" skills that employers believe are critical to job success). The first test under the mandate was in April 2010.

A score of 18 or better is the minimum score needed on the English portion of the ACT to indicate a 50 percent chance of obtaining a B or higher, or about a 75 percent chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college course of English composition. GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the high school, not the student's place of

A benchmark score is the minimum score needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50 percent chance of obtaining a B or higher, or about a 75 percent chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college courses, which include English composition, algebra, social science, and

TIME FRAME: Data represent a 5-year period estimate. For example, 2017 estimates reflect data collected over a 60-month period from 2013 through 2017. LIMITATIONS: Data are based on a sample and are subject to sampling variability. Margins of error corresponding to a 90% confidence interval can be found at https://bit.ly/2L0BQq1. Characteristics for geographic areas experiencing dynamic change due to such things as an environmental catastrophe (e.g., flood) or a plant closing will be mitigated since these estimates cover five calendar years of data. Also, caution is needed when using the multi-year estimates for estimating year-toyear change in a particular characteristic. This is because four of the five years in the 5-year estimate overlap with the next year's estimate. Licensed Child Care Providers

DEFINITION: This indicator represents individuals or facilities to whom the right, authority, or permission has been granted by the North Dakota Department of Human Services to operate a family child care home, group child care home or facility, child care center, preschool educational facility, school-age program, or multiple license facility. Child care providers who are licensed by the state and located on

tribal lands are included in this category. Licensed Child Care Capacity is the number of children who can be served by licensed child care providers (i.e., child care supply). PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for the number of providers. The denominator for capacity is the total child population ages 0 through 13 where all parents in the household are in the labor force (i.e., potential child care demand) in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the child care program. A total of 36 licensed, out-of-state providers cared for North Dakota children in February 2018 and are included in the state total. These out-of-state licensed providers had the capacity to care for 1,063 children.

TIME FRAME: February of referenced year. SOURCE: Child care numbers are obtained from the North Dakota Department of Human Services. The proportions are calculated based on an estimation of the number of children with working parents, derived from data obtained from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates.

Standard Compliance Certification (SCC) and In-Home Child Care Providers

DEFINITION: This indicator represents two types of non-licensed child care providers. Standard Compliance Certification, also referred to as 'Self-Certified', refers to child care providers who have completed an Affidavit of Standard Compliance and Child Care Provider Contract. This is a voluntary self-certification process for child care providers who are not licensed. Registered In-Home child care providers offer child care services in the child's home. This title reflects a voluntary registration process for child care providers who are not licensed. Child care providers meeting these criteria and located on tribal lands are included in this category. Standard Compliance Certification (SCC) and In-Home Child Care Capacity is the number of children who can be served by standard compliance and registered in-home child care providers (i.e., child care supply).

PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for the number of providers. The denominator for capacity is the total child population ages 0 through 13 where all parents in the household are in the labor force (i.e., potential child care demand) in

respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the child care program. A total of three out-of-state, standard compliance and registered in-home providers cared for North Dakota children in February 2018 and are included in the state total. These out-of-state providers had the capacity to care for 15 children.

TIME FRAME: February of referenced year. SOURCE: Child care numbers are obtained from the North Dakota Department of Human Services. The proportions are calculated based on an estimation of the number of children with working parents, derived from data obtained from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates.

Registered Tribal Child Care Providers

DEFINITION: This indicator represents tribal child care providers who are registered with the state of North Dakota, but are not licensed, self-certified, or approved relatives. Authority to provide child care is provided by the Tribal Council or designated Tribal Agency. Registered Tribal Child Care Capacity is the number of children who can be served by tribal child care providers who are registered with the state (i.e., child care supply).

PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for the number of providers. The denominator for capacity is the total child population ages 0 through 13 where all parents in the household are in the labor force (i.e., potential child care demand) in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the child care program.

TIME FRAME: February of referenced year. SOURCE: Child care numbers are obtained from the North Dakota Department of Human Services. The proportions are calculated based on an estimation of the number of children with working parents, derived from data obtained from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates.

Approved Relative Child Care Providers

DEFINITION: This indicator represents a type of non-licensed child care provider. By federal law, the approved relatives must be related by marriage, blood relationship, or appointed by court order. Approved relative providers include grandparents, aunts, and

uncles. A sibling who is age 18 or older and who does not live in the same home as the child for whom care is being provided can also become an approved relative. Approved relative child care providers located on tribal lands are included in this category. *Approved Relative Child Care Capacity* is the number of children who can be served by approved relative child care providers (i.e., child care supply).

PERCENTAGE: There is no percentage calculated for the number of providers. The denominator for capacity is the total child population ages 0 through 13 where all parents in the household are in the labor force (i.e., potential child care demand) in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the child care program.

TIME FRAME: February of referenced year. SOURCE: Child care numbers are obtained from the North Dakota Department of Human Services. The proportions are calculated based on an estimation of the number of children with working parents, derived from data obtained from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates.

HEALTH

Births with Prenatal Care Beginning After the First Trimester or Not at All

DEFINITION: This indicator represents births to mothers who receive no prenatal care at all, or receive prenatal care beginning after the first trimester. The first trimester is calculated, based on elements obtained from the birth certificate, as the date of LMP (last menstrual period) through day 88 of the pregnancy.

PERCENTAGE: The denominator is total resident live births in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the mother's place of residence rather than the location of the hospital where the birth occurred.

TIME FRAME: Calendar Year (January 1 through December 31).

LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of births to mothers receiving late or no prenatal care is one through five. In these cases, '<6' is indicated.

NOTE: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention uses a different method than the North Dakota Department of Health to calculate days in a trimester. Thus, numbers released by the CDC will differ from those published here.

Low Birth Weight Births

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of babies who weigh less than 2,500 grams (5 pounds, 8 ounces) at birth, as recorded by birth certificates.

PERCENTAGE: The denominator is total resident live births in respective geographic areas

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the mother's place of residence rather than the location of the hospital where the birth occurred.

TIME FRAME: Calendar Year (January 1)

TIME FRAME: Calendar Year (January 1 through December 31).

LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of low weight births is one through five. In these cases, '<6' is indicated.

SOURCE: North Dakota Department of Health, Division of Vital Records.

Deaths of Infants Less Than 1 Year of Age

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of deaths occurring to infants less than 1 year of age, as recorded on death certificates.

PERCENTAGE: The denominator is total resident live births in respective geographic areas

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the infant's place of residence rather than the location of death.

TIME FRAME: Calendar Year (January 1 through December 31).

LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of infant deaths is one through five. In these cases, '<6' is indicated.

SOURCE: North Dakota Department of Health, Division of Vital Records.

Deaths of Children Ages 1-19

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of deaths of children and youth ages 1 through 19, as recorded on death certificates.

PERCENTAGE: The denominator is total resident deaths in respective geographic areas

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the child's place of residence rather than the location of death.

TIME FRAME: Calendar Year (January 1 through December 31).

LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of child deaths is one through five. In these cases, '<6' is indicated.

SOURCE: North Dakota Department of Health, Division of Vital Records.

Newborns Born at a Medical Facility Receiving a Hearing Screening

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of newborns born in North Dakota medical facilities who received a hearing screening prior to hospital discharge. There are three possible outcomes for a birth hearing screening: Pass Both, Bilateral Referral, and Unilateral Referral. A Pass Both indicates an infant had the birth hearing screen and passed in both ears indicating normal hearing. A Bilateral Referral indicates an infant failed the birth hearing screen in both ears and is recommended to have an outpatient rescreen completed by one month of age. A Unilateral Referral indicates an infant failed one ear during the birth hearing screen but passed the other ear, and is recommended to have an outpatient re-screen completed by one month of age. Infants with a Bilateral and Unilateral Referral birth screen outcome should be offered an Early Intervention services referral. Did Not Pass the Initial Hearing Screening represents the number of resident newborns who were screened for hearing loss and identified as having some form of hearing impairment, and were referred for further testing (i.e., a Bilateral or Unilateral Referral).

PERCENTAGE: The denominator for the main indicator is total resident live births in respective geographic areas. The denominator for the subcategory is the number of screened births in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data include hospital births to North Dakota residents and are presented based on the mother's/guardian's county of residence. Out-of-state births to North Dakota residents are excluded.

TIME FRAME: Calendar Year (January 1 through December 31).

LIMITATIONS: Data are not reported for geographies where the number of screened births is one through five. In these cases, '<6' is indicated.

NOTE: Situations for which a screening

did not take place include those in which the infant died before a screening could take place and those for which the parents refused consent to have their child's hearing screened. It is currently unknown if hearing screenings are performed on the home birth population.

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program Participants

DEFINITION: This indicator represents persons who are eligible for and receive a food voucher and nutrition education contract through the WIC Program. To be eligible for WIC, low-income women, infants, and children must be found to be at nutritional risk for medical or dietary reasons. WIC is a prevention program targeted to provide nutrition education, nutritious food, and access to health care. WIC is not an entitlement program. GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the participant's place of residence.

TIME FRAME: Fiscal Year (July 1 through June 30).

LIMITATIONS: Fort Berthold and Standing Rock Indian reservations administer their own programs. Thus, data for these two reservations are not included in the state WIC numbers. North Dakota WIC data do cover the Spirit Lake and Turtle Mountain reservations as well as the Trenton Indian Service Area.

Medicaid Recipients Ages 0-20

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of persons ages 0 through 20 who are recipients of Medicaid. Medicaid is a federally funded entitlement program available to eligible persons based upon need. It is designed to assist individuals and families who do not have enough income to obtain health care. Medicaid is authorized by Title XIX, a 1965 amendment to the federal Social Security Act. Medicaid differs from Medicare, which is a federally funded program for the elderly and disabled. PERCENTAGE: The denominator is the total population ages 0 through 20 in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect place of residence.

TIME FRAME: Fiscal Year (July 1 through June 30).

SOURCE: North Dakota Department of Human Services.

Children 0-18 Enrolled in Healthy Steps

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of persons ages 0 through 18 who are enrolled in Healthy Steps, the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in North Dakota. Healthy Steps is intended to help those children in working families that earn too much to qualify for Medicaid but not enough for private insurance.

PERCENTAGE: The denominator is the total population ages 0 through 18 in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect place of residence.

TIME FRAME: Fiscal Year (July 1 through June 30).

SOURCE: North Dakota Department of Human Services.

Uninsured Children Ages 0-18

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of children under the age of 19 who are not covered by health insurance. At or Below 200% of Poverty represents the number of children under the age of 19 who are not covered by health insurance and are living in families with incomes at or below 200% of the federal poverty level (i.e., families with incomes less than twice the federal poverty level).

PERCENTAGE: The denominator for the main indicator is the total child population ages 0 through 18 in respective geographic areas. The denominator for the subcategory is all uninsured children ages 0 through 18. GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect place of residence.

TIME FRAME: Calendar Year (January 1 through December 31).

LIMITATIONS: The estimates are based on statistical models combining survey data with population estimates and administrative records. As such, they are subject to modeling error. SAFETY AND RISKY BEHAVIOR

Child Abuse and Neglect Reports

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the total number of official assessments made to the North Dakota Department of Human Services (NDDHS) on behalf of a child where there is the suspicion of child abuse or neglect. Child abuse and neglect refers to any recent act or failure to act on the part of a parent or caregiver which results in death, serious physical or emotional harm, sexual abuse or exploitation, or an act or failure to act which presents an imminent risk of serious harm.

Physical harm refers to any non-accidental physical injury to the child, and can include striking, kicking, burning, or biting the child, or any action that results in a physical impairment of the child. Sexual abuse involves sexual contact between a child and an adult or a significantly older, more powerful person. Sexual abuse may include other exploitative behaviors such as inappropriate sexual comments made to a child, taking or showing sexually explicit photographs or exposing a child to pornography or adult sexual activity. Emotional harm refers to injury to the psychological capacity or emotional stability of the child as evidenced by an observable or substantial change in behavior, emotional response or cognition, or as evidenced by anxiety, depression, withdrawal, or aggressive behavior. A neglected child, also referred to as a deprived child, refers to a child who 1) is without proper parental care or control, subsistence, education, or other care or control necessary for the child's physical, mental, and emotional health, or morals, and the deprivation is not due primarily to the lack of financial means of the child's parents, guardian, or other custodian; 2) has been placed for care or adoption in violation of law; 3) is without proper parental care, control, education, or other care and control necessary for the child's well-being because of the physical, mental, emotional, or other illness or disability of the child's parent or parents, and that such lack of care is not due to a willful act of commission or act of omission by the child's parents, and care is requested by a parent; 4) is in need of treatment, and whose parents, guardian, or other custodian

have refused to participate in treatment as ordered by the juvenile court; 5) was subject to prenatal exposure to chronic and severe use of alcohol or any controlled substance in a manner not lawfully prescribed by a practitioner; 6) is present in an environment subjecting the child to exposure to a controlled substance or drug paraphernalia. Abandonment of a child refers to a situation in which 1) the parent's identity or whereabouts are unknown, 2) the child has been left by the parent in circumstances where the child suffers serious harm, or 3) the parent has failed to maintain contact with the child or to provide reasonable support for a specified period of time.

The North Dakota Century Code mandates certain persons (those who have contact with children as a part of their professional duties) to report incidents of suspected child abuse or neglect. Any person may report an incident. The NDDHS or its designated agent, a regional or county Child Protection Service (CPS) social worker, will respond to the report by conducting an assessment of the family being reported. This process allows for the assessment of present safety of the child(ren) and the risk of future maltreatment, while simultaneously noting family strengths and needs. These strengths, along with any necessary service interventions, may lead to the amelioration of child maltreatment within a particular family. The CPS social workers use a risk assessment tool to help direct the intervention and assessment process. CPS teams determine if 1) services are required or 2) services are not required. Services are required if a high level of risk is determined to exist for the child(ren), and/or the family's needs are such that immediate service is required in order to lessen the safety risk. When it is determined that services are required, North Dakota Century Code requires a referral to Juvenile Court and a social worker (case manager) must be assigned to coordinate services. If no services are required, it has been determined that 1) no to low risk for the child(ren) exists, and/or 2) the CPS team suggests a discussion with the family on the availability of services, which are unrelated to any specific risk factors, or 3) the family's service need is nonexistent. Services may be offered or recommended to the family even though no services are required for the protection of a child.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the assessment.

TIME FRAME: Federal Fiscal Year (October 1 through September 30). LIMITATIONS: Reports of child abuse and neglect from tribal lands are processed separately and are not included in these numbers. Data are not reported for geographies where the number of child abuse and neglect reports is five or less. In these cases, '<6' is indicated. Data for Mercer, McLean, Oliver, and Sheridan counties are reported under McLean County (Dakota Central Social Services). NOTE: In an effort to coordinate with federal reporting procedures, data regarding child abuse and neglect are presented for the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) (October-September) rather than for the Calendar Year (CY) (January-December). While trends are consistent between the two reporting procedures, please use caution when comparing FFY data (first reported in the 2007 Fact Book) with CY data which were reported prior to the 2007 Fact Book. Suspected Victims of Child Abuse and Neglect

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of children involved in assessments made to the North Dakota Department of Human Services (NDDHS) where there is the suspicion of child abuse or neglect (see the Child Abuse and Neglect Reports indicator definition for detailed definitions of abuse and neglect, and a description of the assessment process). Child Protection Service (CPS) social workers use a risk assessment tool to help direct the intervention and assessment process. CPS teams determine if 1) services are required or 2) services are not required. When there are Victims in Cases Where Services Are Required, a high level of risk is determined to exist for the child(ren), and/or the family's needs are such that immediate service is required in order to lessen the safety risk. When it is determined that services are required, North Dakota Century Code requires a referral to Juvenile Court and a social worker (case manager) must be assigned to coordinate services (see the Child Abuse and Neglect Reports indicator definition for detailed definitions of other CPS determinations).

PERCENTAGE: The denominator for the main indicator is the total child population ages 0 through 17 in respective geographic areas. The denominator for the subcategory is the number of suspected child victims in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the location of the assessment.

TIME FRAME: Federal Fiscal Year (October 1 through September 30). LIMITATIONS: Reports of child abuse and neglect from tribal lands are processed separately and are not included in these numbers. Data are not reported for geographies where the number of child abuse and neglect victims is five or less. In these cases, '<6' is indicated. Data for Mercer, McLean, Oliver, and Sheridan counties are reported under McLean County (Dakota Central Social Services). NOTE: In an effort to coordinate with federal reporting procedures, data regarding child abuse and neglect are presented for the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) (October-September) rather than for the Calendar Year (CY) (January-December). While trends are consistent between the two reporting procedures, please use caution when comparing FFY data (first reported in the 2007 Fact Book) with CY data which were reported prior to the 2007 Fact Book. Children Ages 10-17 Referred to Juvenile Court DEFINITION: This indicator represents the

number of youth ages 10 through 17 referred

to juvenile court for delinquent and unruly behavior offenses. It excludes children in cases involving abandonment, abuse/neglect, deprivation, educational neglect, other or no fault deprivation, termination of parental rights, or other special proceedings. PERCENTAGE: The denominator is the total child population ages 10 through 17 in respective geographic areas. GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the offense location, not the juvenile's place of residence. In addition, the number of juveniles is unduplicated only at the county level of geography. Approximately 5.5% of juvenile offenders were referred to court in multiple counties in 2018. In these cases, each juvenile is counted once for each county in which they are referred. Because

the regional and state level data are a sum of the counties, these multi-county offenders are duplicated at the regional and state levels of geography.

TIME FRAME: Calendar Year (January 1 through December 31).

LIMITATIONS: Referrals made to tribal courts in North Dakota are not included in this indicator.

NOTE: A new reporting procedure for juvenile court referrals and offenses was implemented by the North Dakota Supreme Court beginning with 2003 data. In this new reporting procedure, the data reflect the year in which the case was referred to court, not the year when the case was settled (disposition date). This reporting procedure affects data that were first reported by North Dakota KIDS COUNT in the 2005 Fact Book. Thus, caution should be used when making comparisons to data presented in Fact Books prior to the 2005 publication. SOURCE: North Dakota Supreme Court, State Court Administrator's Office.

Children Ages 16-19 Not Enrolled in High School, Not High School Graduates, and Not in the Labor Force

DEFINITION: This indicator represents the number of children ages 16 through 19 who have not completed high school, are not enrolled in school, and are not in the labor force.

PERCENTAGE: The denominator is the total child population ages 16 through 19 in respective geographic areas.

GEOGRAPHY: Data reflect the child's place of residence.

TIME FRAME: Data represent a 5-year period estimate. For example, 2017 estimates reflect data collected over a 60-month period from 2013 through 2017. LIMITATIONS: Data are based on a sample and are subject to sampling variability. Margins of error corresponding to a 90% confidence interval can be found at https://bit.ly/2mcGzpi. Characteristics for geographic areas experiencing dynamic change due to such things as an environmental catastrophe (e.g., flood) or a plant closing will be mitigated since these estimates cover five calendar years of data. Also, caution is needed when using the multi-year estimates for estimating year-toyear change in a particular characteristic. This is because four of the five years in the 5-year estimate overlap with the next year's estimate. Ideally, trend analysis with

multi-year estimates should be done using estimates from non-overlapping periods (e.g., 2008-2012 and 2013-2017). SOURCE: U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year Estimates, Table B14005.
