Martin Attends NCSBN Information Technology and Operations Conference

Kyle Martin, Associate Director for Operations, recently attended the National Council of State Boards of Nursing Information Technology and Operations Conference held in St. Petersburg, Florida.

The two-day conference included a diverse range of topics including fraud detection, supporting remote workforces, online presence,

communication, licensure, business intelligence and analytics, as well as numerous opportunities to collaborate and share best practices.

One breakout session centered its discussion on tools that leverage artificial intelligence (A.I.) to automate workflows and enhance overall services. Martin was able to discuss the NDBON's implementation of an A.I.-powered spam filter that has shielded staff from over 5,000 viruses and attacks since its implementation in April, 2022.

"I was honored to attend this conference on behalf of the North Dakota Board of Nursing," says Martin. "It was interesting to hear from others on how the pandemic presented both challenges and opportunities to other boards and how quickly many boards had to pivot their operations to serve the public online. Most of all I enjoyed the friendships forged at this event and the commitments we made to share with each other our best practices through information technology that can lead to efficient workflows that benefit both our staff and the public."


The focus of the work done by the NLC Executive Committee in May included drafting the strategic plan for the next three years to be presented to the NLC Commissions for consideration in August.

Melissa Hanson, Associate Director for Compliance and Maureen Bentz, Associate Director for Practice recently completed the International Center for Regulatory Scholarship (ICRS) certificate program through the National Council for State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN). Hanson and Bentz attended the first ICRS Advanced Leadership Institute and graduation event in Washington, DC April 6-7, 2022. The event brought participants together to hear world-renowned speakers and network with their peers.

The ICRS program was launched by NCSBN in 2019 to provide nursing regulators, health policy leaders, and other professionals from around the world the opportunity to learn, network, and discover their leadership potential. ICRS's pinnacle offering is the ICRS certificate program – a pioneering, competency-based online and blended course of study – designed to enrich and inspire those entrusted with patient safety.

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Sanford Health, the provider of this educational activity and responsible party for the adherence to ANCC criteria, has worked together with joint providers, Augustana University and Avera Health to design, implement and evaluate this activity. This course has been approved for 39 hours.

United States Department of Education Grants North Dakota Board of Nursing Continued Recognition as State Approval Agency for Nurse Education

The United States Department of Education (DOE) Deputy Under Secretary, Jordan Matsudaira, notified the North Dakota Board of Nursing (NDBON) on May 20, 2022, of his decision to approve the agency's request for renewal of recognition.

The National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity (NACIQI) met on February 23, 2022, to consider the DOE staff analysis report and recommendation related to the NDBON petition for continued recognition. Dr. Tammy Buchholz, Associate Director for Education, attended the virtual meeting as staff representative for the NDBON and answered the Committee's questions regarding the petition and the agency's role in regulating prelicensure nursing education programs in North Dakota. NDBON President Jane Christianson also attended the meeting.

NACIQI unanimously recommended approving the NDBON request for renewal of recognition at the meeting. Mr. Matsudaira concurred with the recommendations of DOE staff and NACIQI and granted the NDBON continued recognition as a statewide programmatic accreditor of nurse education programs in North Dakota for a period of four years.

The NDBON was first recognized by the DOE as an approval agency for nurse education in the State of North Dakota in 2002 for a period of two years and has been continuously recognized nationally since that time. The most recent review of the agency for renewal of its recognition occurred between January 2020 to September 2021. DOE staff virtually observed NDBON survey staff during several nursing program surveys during the review period as part of the recognition renewal review process. The NDBON is one of only five Boards of Nursing in the U.S. that are recognized by the DOE as specialized accrediting agencies.

The North Dakota Board of Nursing is legally authorized to regulate nurse education programs in the North Dakota under the Nurse Practices Act, NDCC and NDAC. The NDBON presently approves three graduate level nursing education programs, seven baccalaureate programs and five associate degree programs designed to prepare individuals for registered nurse licensure. In addition, the NDBON approves three associate degree programs and four certificate programs for practical nursing. Recognition by the DOE enables professional nurse education programs to seek eligibility for federal assistance pursuant to the Nurse Training Act of 1964, as amended. Recognition by the DOE ensures quality, accountability, and improvement of survey processes for the NDBON and provides reassurance to North Dakota citizens about the quality of

nursing education programs in the state.

The DOE provides oversight of the postsecondary accreditation system through its review of all federally recognized accrediting agencies. The DOE holds accrediting agencies accountable by ensuring that they enforce their accreditation standards effectively. Also, as a part of the DOE's oversight roles, the Secretary of Education is required by law to publish a list of nationally recognized accrediting agencies that the Secretary determines to be reliable authorities as to the quality of education or training provided by the institutions of higher education and the higher education programs they accredit. The U.S. Secretary of Education also recognizes State agencies for the approval of public postsecondary vocational education and nurse education.





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



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
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
